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- (a) Health and wellness information are provided to youth during orientation at the time of admission to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) and through the ongoing delivery of health care services to youth while in TJJD custody. See the Nutrition and Food Service Manual Appendix G for wellness program information.
 - (b) Health education and wellness information provided to youth include topics such as access to health care services, personal hygiene, dental care, prevention of communicable diseases, family planning, self-care for chronic conditions, self-care examination, and the benefits of exercise and healthy diet. Specified youth also receive substance abuse education through the Alcohol and Other Drug Treatment Program.
 - (c) Health education is also provided on an individualized basis through chronic care clinic, health-related encounters, and discharge/release preparation.
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
