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Foreword

The Texas Juvenile Probation Commission's (TJPC) annual activity report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile criminal activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to assist the state's effort to improve the juvenile justice system and reduce juvenile crime in Texas.

During calendar year 2000, police agencies in Texas processed 143,904 arrests of juveniles between the ages of 10 and 17. Of this number, 55,412 were warned and released, handled in justice and municipal courts or diverted, and 88,492 were referred to juvenile probation departments. Social agencies, parents, schools, and the Texas Youth Commission (TYC) referred another 24,654 cases, for a total of 113,146 referrals to juvenile probation departments.

This is a decrease of 5,850 (4.9%) total referrals from the previous year, which is the fifth consecutive decrease of referrals in Texas. Decreases occurred in all referral type categories with the exception of violation of probation orders, which increased 3.8% from 1999. The largest change in referral type categories was the 12.0% decrease in CINS offenses.

All of the 254 counties in Texas received services through 164 juvenile probation departments in 2000. These departments were staffed by a total of 6,461 employees, 1,957 of whom carried a probation caseload.

Counties registered and operated 43 secure pre-adjudication residential facilities, eight holdover facilities, and 28 secure post-adjudication residential facilities in 2000. In addition to the county-operated facilities, private contractors provided services for juveniles in 18 pre-adjudication facilities and 13 post-adjudication secure facilities. These facilities provided a combined total of 2,261 pre-adjudication, 40 holdover, and 2,281 post-adjudication beds.


In 2000, 51,488 juveniles were held in secure detention facilities prior to adjudication hearings. Approximately 30% of those detained were released in less than one day. An additional 7,808 placements were made to residential facilities, generally following the disposition.

Juvenile probation departments disposed of 9,458 cases by dismissing or withdrawing the complaint, provided supervisory caution to 26,270 referrals, and initiated 15,234 deferred prosecutions.

Juvenile prosecutors, independently or through their juvenile courts, entered 2,044 supervisory cautions, 5,591 deferred prosecutions, and 28,173 new or modified probation orders. Juvenile courts also committed 2,650 juveniles to the Texas Youth Commission and certified 198 juveniles to stand trial as adults. There were 22,834 cases refused prosecution, dismissed, consolidated, or otherwise disposed.

Texas Juvenile Probation System

Introduction

TJPC collects statistical data relating to juveniles referred to the juvenile justice system from the 164 probation departments covering all Texas counties. Beginning January 1999, each department was required to submit individual case file data in an electronic format, replacing the aggregate reporting methods used in previous years. In addition, TJPC periodically surveys the departments to obtain supplemental information.

Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from the statistics. The data portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics.

At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics and should be considered when evaluating them:

1. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Emphasis is placed on the rehabilitation of the juvenile through accountability, guidance, counseling, diversion, and treatment. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as *supervisory caution* or *dismissed or otherwise disposed*, in fact occasion rehabilitative efforts on the part of the juvenile probation system.
2. A number of the juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies.

3. Juvenile probation officers in multi-county departments spend more time traveling than do officers in single-county jurisdictions.

Juvenile Boards

State law requires each county to have a juvenile board, while some of these govern multiple counties. In 2000, there were 172 juvenile boards in Texas. Each board, consisting of district and county judges, is responsible for overseeing the operations of the juvenile justice system in that county, which includes designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer, and setting the policy and budget for the juvenile probation department. TJPC provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.

Funding. The Commission is the primary agency through which state funding for juvenile justice is channeled to the counties. During fiscal year 2000, TJPC sent nearly 100 million dollars to county juvenile boards for their local probation departments. Total revenues appropriated to TJPC increased 159 percent over a five year period, from \$41,646,687 in fiscal year 1995 to \$107,885,022 in fiscal year 2000.

State funds account for only about 34 percent of total funding for juvenile probation. Local commissioner's courts provide approximately 64 percent of the total from county revenues. Juvenile boards work closely with the commissioner's courts to set budgets for the operation of the local juvenile probation departments using both local and state funds. The remaining two percent of funds comes from federal and other entities.



Juvenile Probation Departments

Structure. Juvenile probation departments implement the policies of juvenile boards and deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts. There are 119 single-county departments and 45 multi-county departments in Texas. Multi-county departments range from two to six counties. While seventeen departments served both adult and juvenile probationers, 13 of these combined departments used separate juvenile probation officers.

Certification of Officers. TJPC requires that all Texas juvenile probation, detention, and corrections officers are certified as having earned necessary academic degrees and completed 40 hours annually of approved continuing education. Training is provided by TJPC for juvenile

judges and all levels of juvenile probation personnel to count toward the necessary hours of continuing education.

During 2000, TJPC certified 344 new juvenile probation officers, 712 detention officers, and 710 corrections child-care workers. An additional 1,701 existing officers were also re-certified.

Salaries and Staffing. Based on data received from local departments in the annual Resource Report, there were 6,461 salaried personnel in juvenile probation departments across Texas at the end of 2000. This represents 218 more employees than in 1999. Eight of the departments had only one employee (a Chief Juvenile Probation Officer). The following table shows the breakdown of department staff and their salaries.

Caseloads. Data received in the Resource Report indicate that the average daily caseload per caseload-carrying officer in Texas juvenile probation departments ranges from two to 68 juveniles, with a statewide average of 28. Some departments, primarily larger-sized ones, employ officers that carry specialized caseloads of one specific type of case only. For these specialized officers, the average daily caseload for deferred prosecution cases was 36, for adjudicated probation it was 32, and for intensive supervision probation it was 16.

Juvenile Justice and Education. Juvenile justice alternative education programs – also known as JJAEPs – provide continued education services for youth that have been expelled from the public school system. JJAEPs are mandated in counties with populations of more than 125,000.

In fiscal year 2000 (school year) there were 22 mandatory juvenile justice alternative education programs (JJAEPs) operating in Texas. In addition, nine JJAEPs operated with grant funds in counties with populations of less than 125,000. Using state funds, the 31 JJAEPs had 5,997 student entries into the programs. Approximately 68% of the students in state-funded programs were expelled from the school districts for discretionary reasons, most commonly for serious or persistent misconduct.

Another 294 youth were served in non-mandated, non-state-funded JJAEPs operated by eight juvenile probation departments.

Restitution. Nearly every juvenile probation department utilized both

community service restitution and financial restitution in 2000. More than 32,000 juveniles provided over 2.3 million hours of community service in response to the offenses for which they were referred. Additionally, nearly 16,700 juveniles paid over \$4.1 million statewide in financial restitution.

Substance Abuse Services. Drug or alcohol tests were utilized in nearly all (95%) of the juvenile probation departments and were administered on approximately 54,235 referrals statewide. Substance abuse prevention or counseling services were provided to approximately 17,036 referrals in 2000. At the same time, 2,840 referrals received TCADA-licensed non-residential treatment and 1,304 received TCADA-licensed residential treatment for substance abuse issues.

Departments spent approximately \$16.6 million on substance abuse treatment services. Approximately 3,351 referrals needed substance abuse services or treatment but did not receive any due to insufficient resources.

Mental Health Services. Juvenile probation departments indicated on the annual Resource Report that approximately 14,005 juveniles were in need of mental health services during 2000. However, during this period, only approximately 8,331 juveniles received the services.


Sex Offender Services. During 2000, approximately 551 juveniles received in-patient sex offender treatment, and 960 juveniles received out-patient treatment.



Programs. Each department provides at least basic supervision services. The table below shows the extent to which

departments operate programs beyond basic supervision.

Juvenile Population

The Texas juvenile justice system serves youth between the ages of 10 and 16, and 17 if the offense was committed when the youth was 16 years old or younger. United States Census 2000 data were not yet available at the time this report was published. Using the Texas State Data Center projections, there were 2,106,263


juveniles in Texas in 2000. The map below illustrates the densest juvenile population areas in the state. The appendix of this report contains population data per county (see Juvenile Referral Activity – County Specific Details).

Texas Juvenile Population in 2000






Juvenile Referral Activity in 2000






Texas Juvenile Crime Clock – Delinquent Juvenile Crime in 2000

1991 - 2000




There were 113,146 referrals to juvenile probation authorities in Texas, a decrease of 4.9% from 1999, the fifth consecutive decrease in total referrals since 1995. This decrease occurred while there was a slight increase (0.6%) in the projected juvenile-aged population.

referral. Referrals in 2000 consisted of 155,240 separate offenses (does not include data from Bexar County), for an average of 1.5 offenses per referral.


A youth may be referred to a juvenile probation department for more than one offense in a single referral. In this case, the most serious offense counts as the

The number of juveniles referred also decreased for the fifth consecutive year in 2000, from 82,096 (average of 1.45 referrals per juvenile) in 1999, to 79,207 (average of 1.43 referrals per juvenile) in 2000.

Offense Distribution. As illustrated in the chart below, the percent of total referrals that were for alleged felony offenses has remained consistently just over 20 percent during the past three years. Of this number, the percent referred for violent felony offenses has increased very slightly, while the percent of non-violent felony offenses has slightly decreased.

While as a percent of total referrals, violent felony referrals slightly increased, the actual number of referrals decreased 2.5%, from 6,509 in 1999 to 6,346 in 2000. Of these, the greatest percentage decrease occurred in homicide referrals – down 36.5%, from 123 in 1999 to 78 in 2000.


The category of misdemeanor A & B violations (which also include contempt of magistrate orders) slightly increased as a

percent of total referrals over the past three years. Nearly half (44.9%) of all referrals in 2000 were for these alleged, non-felony delinquent offenses.

Violation of probation order referrals have increased consistently as a percentage of total referrals. This was the only broad category of referral type that total numbers increased from the previous year – from 12,635 in 1999 to 13,111 in 2000.


The number of CINS offense referrals decreased 12.0%, from 29,666 in 1999 to 26,116 in 2000. As a percent of the total number of referrals, they have steadily decreased over the past three years. The number of status offense referrals decreased by 7.4%, while the remainder of the CINS change occurred with misdemeanor C and other non-status CINS offenses.

1998 - 2000




Profile of Offenders. More than 70% of all referrals in 2000 were male. The proportion of female offenders has gradually increased over the years – 24.0% one decade ago to 29.2% in 2000. The percentage of delinquent offense referrals committed by females was 24.2%, compared to a much higher 46.7% of CINS offense referrals committed by females.

Gender Distribution of Referrals




While Anglo youth make up nearly half (48.4%) of the juvenile population, they accounted for only 36.1% of the referrals. Hispanic juveniles were the second most populous group (36.0%), but accounted for the most referrals in 2000, 40.4%. African American youth made up 13.0% of the population and 22.4% of the referrals.

The average age of juvenile referrals was between 14 and 15 years of age. However, sixteen-year-olds were referred to juvenile probation more frequently than any other age.

Age Distribution of Referrals



More than half of the juveniles referred in 2000 were living with one parent and approximately one third were living with two parents. Most of the remaining youth lived with other relatives, such as grandparents or an aunt and uncle.

Almost nine out of ten juveniles referred were attending regular school. The remaining juveniles were in an alternative education center, suspended, expelled, or dropped out of school entirely.

Police agencies made nearly eight out of ten referrals. Most of the remaining referrals were made by schools, parents, social agencies, or other probation departments.




Referral Rates. The average referral rate in 2000 for Texas juvenile probation departments was 53.7 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population.


The following map illustrates felony referral rates for 2000 throughout the state. As illustrated on the map, high felony

referral rates occur in all regions of the state – not necessarily just in the urban counties. In fact, of the seven largest counties, Dallas, El Paso, Tarrant and Travis counties are in the medium-rate group, while Bexar, Harris and Hidalgo counties are in the low-rate group.

Juvenile History for Referrals in 2000




Referral History. More than half of the referrals (53%) had been referred before, with 25% having been previously adjudicated by the courts and 0.6% having been previously committed to the Texas Youth Commission.

Of those with prior referrals, 41% had a felony as the most severe offense in their referral history; 44% had a misdemeanor A or B offense as the most serious offense; and 15% had a CINS offense as the most serious offense.



1999 Re-Contact with Juvenile Probation Departments




Re-Contact Rates. As illustrated on the chart above, two thirds of the juveniles referred in 1999 did not have a re-contact (i.e., a subsequent referral) within one year. The remaining one third did return within the year with a subsequent referral. This subsequent contact occurred an average of 117 days after the first referral in 1999.

Of those whose first referral in 1999 was for a felony offense, 34% had a re-contact with the probation

department. For misdemeanor A or B offenses, 30% had a re-contact; for violation of probation, 49% had a re-contact; and for CINS offenses, 37% had a re-contact.

When a subsequent referral did occur, slightly more than one-third (36.8%) of the juveniles were referred with a more serious offense on the initial re-contact; one-third (32.4%) returned with an offense of equal severity; and slightly less than one-third (30.8%) returned with a less severe offense.

Offense Severity Rate of Initial Re-Contact with Juvenile Probation




Referral and Population Projections. The Criminal Justice Policy Council is mandated by the Texas Legislature to project juvenile justice correctional populations. In their report titled "Projection of Juvenile Justice Correctional Populations: Fiscal Years 2000 – 2005" (June 15, 2000), juvenile probation referrals are projected to increase 18.6% to 134,208 in calendar year 2005.

This projected increase in referrals is based in part on the projected increase in the juvenile-aged population. According to the Texas State Data Center, the juvenile population in Texas is expected to increase

significantly. From 1996 to 2000, the juvenile population increased 2.2%, from 2,060,161 to 2,106,263. The population projection between 2001 and 2005 is expected to increase 8.1%, from 2,146,971 to 2,321,002.

The following table illustrates past referral and population data with the Criminal Justice Policy Council's referral projections and juvenile population projections for the next five years. Historically, referrals peaked in 1995 when there were 133,866 referrals to juvenile probation departments.


Juvenile Disposition and Supervision Workload Activity in 2000





Dispositions were made in 112,452 juvenile cases in calendar year 2000. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 50,962 of these cases, with 9,458 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 26,270 cases given supervisory caution, and 15,234 cases placed on deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 15,157 cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,120 cases with supervisory caution and 3,683 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found on 3,283 referrals, while 7,017 were refused and non-suited.

The remaining 46,333 cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution to 924 cases; deferred prosecution on 1,908 cases; adjudicated new or modified probation to 28,173 cases; certified and transferred to adult court 198 cases; adjudicated and committed to TYC 2,650 cases (2,508 with indeterminate sentences and 142 with determinate sentences); and consolidated, transferred, dismissed, or found not guilty 12,480 cases.



Distribution of Dispositions by Offense Severity and Race. In general, dispositions varied logically with the severity of the offense. As evidenced in the table titled *Dispositions by Offense Severity in 2000* on the previous page, a high proportion of CINS offenses (60%) received a supervisory caution disposition. The more serious offense categories of felony and violation of probation had a much higher proportion of probation and commitments to the Texas Youth Commission than did CINS and misdemeanor A and B offenses categories.

The next table, *Dispositions by Race in 2000*, illustrates that a higher proportion of Anglo juveniles received supervisory caution and deferred prosecution

dispositions than did Hispanic and African American juveniles. A higher proportion of African American juveniles were disposed to probation and the Texas Youth Commission than were Hispanic or Anglo juveniles.

Some background to the difference in dispositions among racial groups may be seen in the offense severity distribution. A similar proportion of African American and Anglo juveniles were disposed for felony offenses. However, African American juveniles were more likely to be disposed for a violation of probation than were Hispanic or Anglo juveniles.




Beyond Juvenile Probation. The number of juveniles certified to stand trial as an adult decreased 16.1% from 236 in 1999 to 198 in 2000. At the same time, a decrease in both the number of commitments to the Texas Youth Commission (TYC) and the rate of TYC commitments as a percentage of total referrals occurred.

In 2000, juvenile courts committed 2,650 referrals (2.3% of total referrals) to TYC, compared to 3,002 referrals (2.5% of total referrals) in 1999. The decrease in commitments to TYC was partly due to

several factors. One was the decrease in the number of referrals.

Another major factor for the decrease was the TYC commitment restriction set forth by House Bill 2947, which became effective September 1999. This bill prohibits committing a child to TYC on a misdemeanor offense or violation of misdemeanor probation unless the child has two prior misdemeanor or felony adjudications.

Supervision Workload Activity


On January 1, 2000, there were 40,689 cases of juveniles receiving active supervision from juvenile probation departments. During the year, 28,595 court-ordered probations, 22,920 deferred prosecutions, and 39,399 conditional releases and other pre-disposition monitoring cases were added for a total of 90,914 new supervisions.

On average, there were 23,256 juveniles on court-ordered, or adjudicated, probation per day during 2000 (not including Bexar County data). These juveniles were supervised for an average of 302 days each. During 2000, 3,976 (14.2%) of the 28,039 supervisions leaving court-ordered probation were unsuccessful in their completion of the program. These

probationers were either committed to the Texas Youth Commission, transferred to an adult criminal trial, absconded and did not return to the program, or terminated early due to persistent non-compliance to program requirements.

The average daily population of supervisions of deferred prosecution was 9,214. These juveniles were each supervised for an average of 153 days (not including Bexar County data). Of the 22,539 supervisions leaving deferred prosecution, 4,399 (19.5%) were unsuccessful in their completion of the program. These juveniles were unsuccessful for the same reasons as the court-ordered probationers, or they were adjudicated to probation during their deferred prosecution supervision period.

Juvenile Detention and Residential Placement Activity

Detention Activity. There were 51,488 placements made in the 69 pre-adjudication secure residential or holdover facilities during 2000. Contrary to the decrease in total referrals from 1999, the incidence of secure detention increased 2.6% in the state. On average, 1,650 youth were securely detained each day of the year in a Texas facility (not including Bexar County data).

These youth were each detained for an average of 12 days. More than 30% of all juveniles securely detained were released in less than one day; approximately 28% were detained for more than ten days.

Residential Placement Activity. A total of 7,808 out-of-home residential placements were made during 2000. The placements were made in both secure and non-secure residential facilities but did not include secure pre-adjudication or holdover facility placements. These juveniles were placed for an average of 129 days at an average cost of \$77.62 per day.

During fiscal year 2000, \$26,763,349 of state probation funds was budgeted for

placement services. Counties without residential placement funds are forced to seek out alternatives to residential placements, such as finding free placements in the private sector or committing to the Texas Youth Commission juveniles who need to be removed from their homes.

According to the annual Resource Report, approximately 880 juveniles were denied access to residential placement due to insufficient resources such as funding or available bed space in 2000.


Registry of Secure Facilities. TJPC maintains a statewide registry for all public and private secure juvenile and holdover facilities in Texas. The statewide registry functions as a database of information about each secure juvenile facility operating in the state. Under the Texas Family Code, no child shall be placed into a secure facility that is not registered with TJPC. The table on the following page shows the number and types of facilities listed in the 2001 Secure Facilities Registry (data reflects calendar year 2000).

Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology





Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology

Active Cases - cases detained, placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

Adjudicated Probation - after going to court for an adjudication hearing on the facts, a judge may order this form of community-based supervision for a specified period of time, based on such reasonable and lawful terms as the court may determine. While on adjudicated probation, the offender may be required to participate in any program deemed appropriate, such as an intensive supervision program or residential placement.

Average Daily Population - average number of active juveniles detained, placed or supervised for a specified period of time.

Average Length of Stay - average number of days completed cases spent in detention, on placement or under supervision for a specified period of time.

Certification as an Adult - situation wherein the juvenile court waives its jurisdiction so that an accused juvenile felony offender can be prosecuted as an adult. Certification is permissive and not mandatory under Texas law. Depending upon the type of felony committed, a juvenile as young as either 14 or 15 years of age can be certified to stand trial as an adult.

Child/Juvenile - in Texas, a person who is 10 years of age or older and under 17 years of age or a person who is 17 years of age or older and under 18 years of age who is alleged or found to have engaged in delinquent conduct or CINS as a result of acts committed before becoming 17 years of age.

Commitment - a child committed to the care, control and custody of the Texas Youth Commission (TYC). All commitments to the TYC, except under the determinate sentencing act, are for an indeterminate term not to extend beyond the child's 21st birthday.

Completed Cases - cases terminated from detention, placement or supervision during a specified period of time.

Conditional Release From Detention - juvenile released from detention or from the department's custody under written orders of conditional release. Most conditional releases are done at the time of the detention hearing or under authorization from the judge. The conditions should be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary to ensure the juvenile will return to court.

Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS) - public intoxication, truancy, running away from home, fineable only offenses that have been transferred to a juvenile court from a municipal or justice court, inhalant abuse, expulsion for violating a school disciplinary code, or a violation of a court order under the Services to At Risk Youth Programs.

Deferred Prosecution - a voluntary alternative to adjudication where the child, parent/guardian(s), prosecutor and the juvenile probation department agree upon probation conditions. Deferred prosecution can last up to six months. If the child violates any of the probation conditions, the state may elect to proceed with formal court adjudication.

Delinquent Conduct - violation of any law punishable by incarceration (except traffic laws), violation of juvenile court orders entered under Section 54.04 or 54.05 of the Texas Family Code (except by truancy, running away, or fineable only offenses), contempt of magistrate orders, D.W.I. and other related offenses and third offense driving under the influence of alcohol by a minor.

Department - a juvenile probation department organized and delivering services in one or more counties and supervised by one or more juvenile boards.

Detention - any secure public or private residential facility that is used for the temporary placement of a juvenile accused of having committed an offense, any non-offender, or any other individual accused of having committed a criminal offense.



Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology (continued)

Determinate Commitment - sentence imposed on a juvenile offender for up to 40 years. The juvenile will first serve time in TYC but may later be transferred to adult prison and become subject to adult parole laws. A determinate sentence is only available for certain types of felony offenses.

Disposition - after adjudication where the judge decides what probation conditions will be imposed upon the child (and the child's family) or whether to commit the child to the Texas Youth Commission.

Diversionsary Placement - residential placement program for juvenile referrals using the state Community Corrections Assistance Fund. This placement is intended to be the last alternative to sending the offender to the Texas Youth Commission.

Intensive Supervision Program (ISP) - type of probation that is a cost-effective means of diverting juvenile offenders from committal to the Texas Youth Commission. Services provided vary from department to department, but common elements include reduced caseloads by specially trained probation officers and more frequent contacts between the juvenile and his or her probation officer.

Juvenile Board - a body established by law to provide juvenile probation services to a county or counties.

Juvenile Court - a court designated under Section 51.04 of the Texas Family Code, or by other law, to exercise jurisdiction over proceedings under Title 3 of the Texas Family Code.

Program - a non-residential, department-operated or contracted/purchased-service delivery that is conducted over a period of time (i.e., more than one day or a one-time event). A program must have a measurable or reportable objective and outcome. A program serves children who are on some type of supervision.

Progressive Sanctions Guidelines - statutory guidelines for juvenile dispositions designed to give uniformity and predictability to juvenile punishments. There are seven progressively more restrictive sanction levels under the guidelines. An offender's sanction level will be based on the severity of the offense, the offender's prior history, individual circumstances and needs as well as the effectiveness of prior interventions.

Referral (also called Formal Referral) - any occasion when all three of the following conditions exist: (1) delinquent conduct, conduct indicating a need for supervision, or violation of probation was allegedly committed; (2) the juvenile probation department has jurisdiction and venue; and (3) either (a) face-to-face contact occurs with the office or official designated by the juvenile board or (b) written or verbal authorization to detain is given by the office or official designated by the juvenile board.

Residential Placement - placement of child in a non-secure facility (i.e., foster homes, alcohol and drug treatment facilities, halfway houses, MHMR facilities, etc.) or a secure facility (i.e., boot camps, secure county, state, or private facilities, etc.) either with or without a court proceeding.

Success Rate - percentage of successfully completed cases for a specified period of time.

Status Offenses - juvenile offenses that are not criminal when committed by adults; e.g. runaway or truancy.



Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology (continued)

Successful Outcome of Supervision - the completion of the period of supervision without any of the following situations: 1) the juvenile has further court action resulting in commitment to TYC or certification to stand trial as an adult; 2) the juvenile has additional charges being filed as an adult which result in termination of juvenile court supervision; 3) the child absconds and is not returned to supervision; 4) the child's death is a direct result of subsequent criminal conduct; 5) early termination of supervision by the court results from persistent non-compliance to program requirements and refusal to accept services; 6) while under supervision, the child is re-arrested or commits a technical violation and the original supervision is terminated. The outcome of the original supervision is unsuccessful. If, however, the supervision is modified, no outcome should be determined until the modified period of supervision has been completed.

Supervisory Caution - descriptive term for a wide variety of summary, non-judicial dispositions that intake may make of a case. This may include referral of the child to a social agency or a community based first offender program run by law enforcement, contacting parents to inform them of the child's activities, or simply warning the child about his or her activities.

Temporary Pre-Court Monitoring - a voluntary pre-court or pre-disposition agreement between the juvenile, parent/guardian(s) and juvenile probation department. Departments that are temporarily supervising juveniles pending a disposition decision or court action may use this supervision type.
