## **Statistical and Other Data on the Juvenile Justice System in Texas for Calendar Year 2003**

### **Texas Juvenile Probation Commission**

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## Overview

The Texas Juvenile Probation Commission's (TJPC) annual activity report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile criminal activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to assist the state's effort to improve the juvenile justice system and reduce juvenile crime in Texas.

During calendar year 2003, police agencies in Texas processed 143,748 arrests of juveniles between the ages of 10 and 16. Of this number, 61,141 were warned and released, handled in justice and municipal courts, or diverted, and 82,607 were referred to juvenile probation departments. Social service agencies, parents, schools, and the Texas Youth Commission (TYC) referred another 24,731 cases, for a total of 107,338 referrals to juvenile probation departments.

This is an increase of 1,428 (1.4%) total referrals from calendar year 2002. Total delinquent offenses increased nearly 2.6% from 2002; however, within the delinquent category, violent felony offense referrals decreased 3.3%. Violation of probation referrals decreased 1%, and misdemeanor offense referrals increased 5%.

All of the 254 counties in Texas were served through 169 juvenile probation departments in 2003. These departments were staffed by a total of 7,138 employees, 1,888 of whom carried a probation caseload.

Counties registered and operated 51 secure pre-adjudication residential facilities, six holdover facilities, and 33 secure post-adjudication residential facilities in 2003. In addition to the county-operated facilities, private contractors provided services for juveniles in six pre-adjudication facilities, one holdover facility, and 11 post-adjudication secure facilities. These facilities provided a combined total of 2,442 pre-adjudication, 53 holdover, and 2,411 post-adjudication beds.

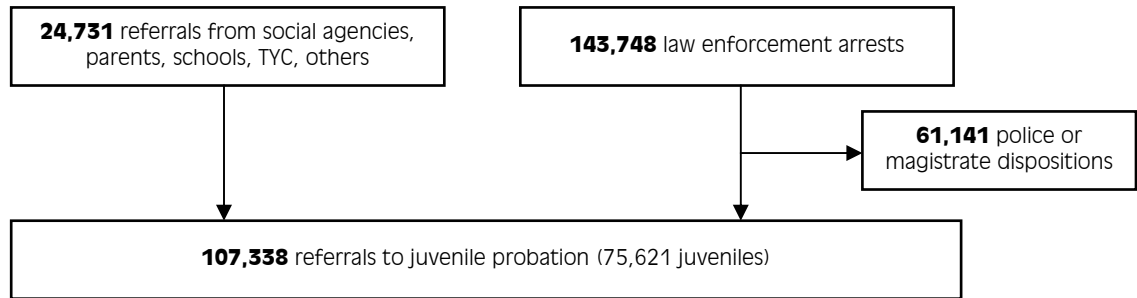
In 2003, 49,814 juveniles were held in secure detention facilities prior to adjudication hearings. Approximately 30% of those detained were released in less than one day. An additional 9,632 placements were made to residential facilities, generally following the disposition.

Dispositions were made in 107,824 juvenile cases in calendar year 2003. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 45,086 of these cases, with 7,684 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 23,167 cases given supervisory caution, and 14,235 cases placed on deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 16,147 cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,125 cases with supervisory caution and 5,226 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 3,162 referrals, while 6,634 were refused and non-suited.

The remaining 46,591 cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution to 999 cases; ordered deferred prosecution to 3,877 cases; adjudicated new or modified probation to 26,423 cases; certified and transferred to adult court 139 cases; adjudicated and committed to TYC 2,519 cases (2,358 with indeterminate sentences and 161 with determinate sentences); and consolidated, transferred, dismissed, or found not guilty 12,634 cases.

# Texas Juvenile Probation System in 2003

## Introduction

TJPC collects statistical data relating to juveniles referred to the juvenile justice system from all counties in the state. Beginning January 1999, each department was required to submit individual case file data in an electronic format, replacing the aggregate reporting methods used in previous years. In addition, TJPC periodically surveys the departments to obtain supplemental information.

Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from the statistics. The data portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics.

At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics and should be considered when evaluating them:

1. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Emphasis is placed on the rehabilitation of the juvenile through accountability, guidance, counseling, diversion, and treatment. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as *supervisory caution* or *dismissed or otherwise disposed*, have received rehabilitative and other services from of the juvenile probation system.
2. A number of the juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies.
3. Juvenile probation officers in multi-county departments may spend more time traveling than do officers in single-county jurisdictions.

## Juvenile Boards

State law requires each county to have a juvenile board. Some of these boards govern multiple counties. Each board, consisting of district and county judges, is responsible for overseeing the operations of the juvenile justice system in that county. This includes designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer and setting the policy and budget for the juvenile probation department. TJPC provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.

Funding. TJPC is the primary agency through which state funding for juvenile justice is channeled to the counties. During fiscal year 2003, TJPC sent more than 143 million dollars to county juvenile boards for their local probation departments. Total revenues passed through to departments in 2003 increased over five percent from the year before, from \$136,337,617 in fiscal year 2002 to \$143,672,740 in fiscal year 2003.

State funds accounted for about 25 percent of total funding for juvenile probation services in fiscal year 2003. Local commissioners courts provided approximately 66 percent of the total from county revenues. Juvenile boards work closely with the commissioners courts to set budgets for operation of local juvenile probation departments using both local and state funds. The remaining nine percent of funds was from federal and other entities.

## Juvenile Probation Departments

Structure. Juvenile probation departments implement the policies of juvenile boards, deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts, and provide services to at risk youth in the community. There were 126 single-county departments and 43 multi-county departments in Texas in 2003. Multi-county departments range in size from two to six counties. While 18 departments served both adult and juvenile probationers in 2003, 15 of these combined departments had designated juvenile probation officers.

Certification of Officers. TJPC requires that all Texas juvenile probation and detention officers be certified. Certification requires that officers have earned the necessary academic degree and complete 40 hours of approved continuing education annually.



During 2003, TJPC certified 254 new juvenile probation officers and 1,237 new detention officers. An additional 2,626 existing officers were re-certified.

Salaries and Staffing. Based on data received from local departments in the Annual Resource Report, there were 7,138 salaried personnel in juvenile probation departments across Texas at the end of 2003. This is an increase of 216 employees over the end of 2002. Eight departments in 2003 had only one employee (a chief juvenile probation officer). The following table shows the breakdown of department staff, average salaries and salary ranges.

Caseloads. Data reported in the Annual Resource Report indicate that the average daily caseload per caseload-carrying juvenile probation officer in Texas ranged from one to 111 juveniles, with a statewide average of 28 in 2003. Some departments, primarily the large and urban departments, employ officers that carry specialized caseloads of one specific type of case only. For these specialized officers, the average daily caseload for deferred prosecution cases was 32, adjudicated probation was 30, and intensive supervision probation was 14.

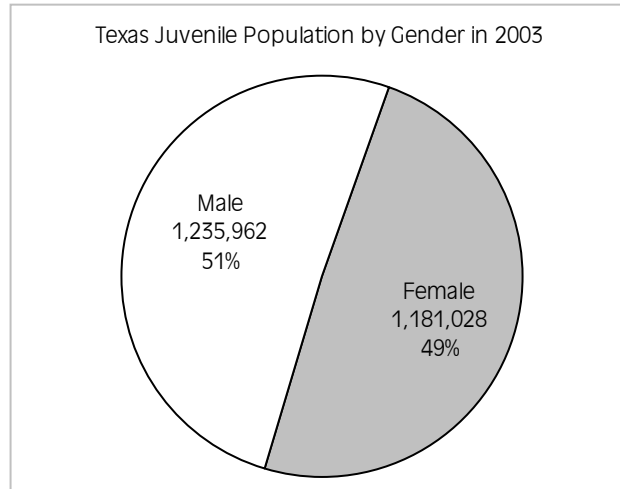
Juvenile Justice and Education. Juvenile Justice Alternative Education programs – also known as JJAEPs – provide education services for youth that have been expelled from the public school system for committing specific offenses. JJAEPs are mandated in counties with populations of more than 125,000.

In school year 2002/2003, there were 26 mandatory JJAEPs operating in Texas. In addition, seven JJAEPs operated with state grant funds in counties with populations of less than 125,000. These 33 JJAEPs had 7,327 student entries into the programs. Approximately 61% of the students in state-funded programs were expelled from the school districts for discretionary reasons, most commonly for serious or persistent misconduct.



**Juvenile Population**

The Texas juvenile justice system serves youth between the ages of 10 and 16, and 17 if the offense was committed when the youth was 16 years old or younger. Using the Texas State Data Center projections based on the United States census 2000 population, there were 2,416,990 juveniles in Texas in 2003. Gender, race and age breakdowns of the projected 2003 figures are shown in the tables below.

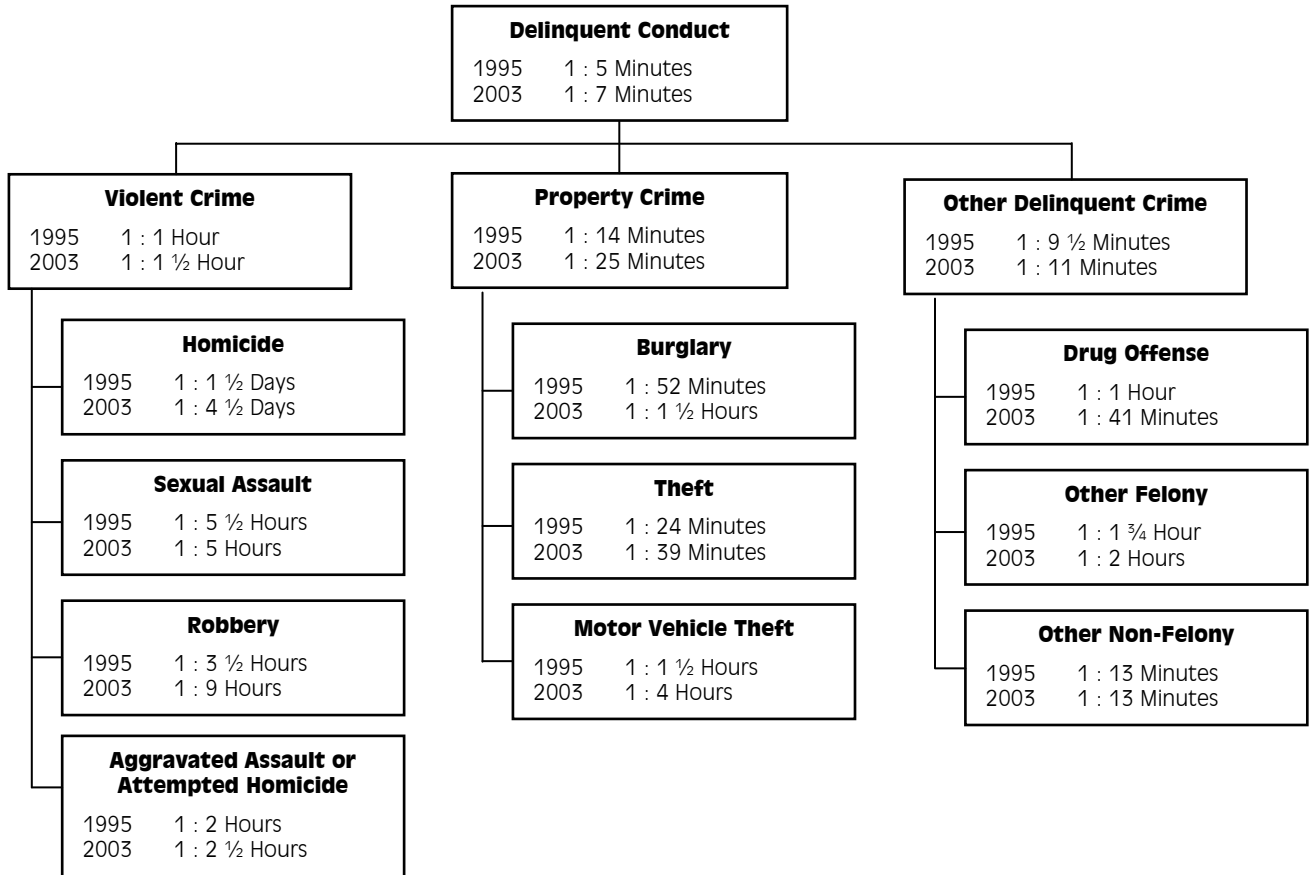


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## Juvenile Referral Activity in 2003

### Juvenile Crime Clock Calendar Year 1995 v. 2003



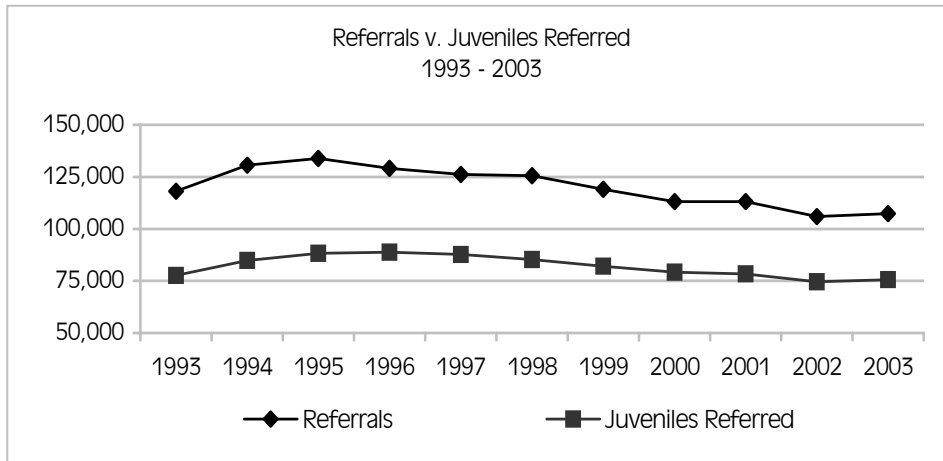
### Referrals Calendar Year 1993 thru 2003

There were 107,338 referrals to juvenile probation departments in calendar year 2003, an increase of 1.4% from 2002. This is the first increase in referrals in six years. The chart on the following page illustrates the number of referrals and the number of individual juveniles referred over the past eleven years.

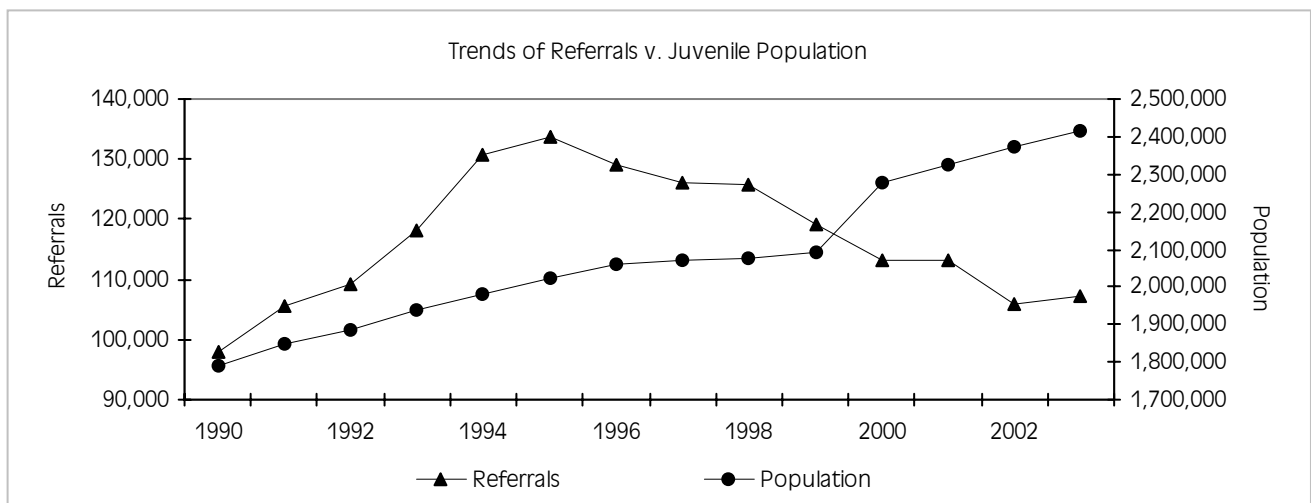
Police agencies made nearly eight out of ten formal referrals. Schools, parents, social agencies, or other probation departments made the remaining referrals during the year.

A youth may be referred to a juvenile probation department for more than one offense in a single referral. When this happens, the most serious offense counts as the primary referral offense. Referrals in 2003 consisted of 134,527 separate offenses, for an average of 1.25 offenses per referral.

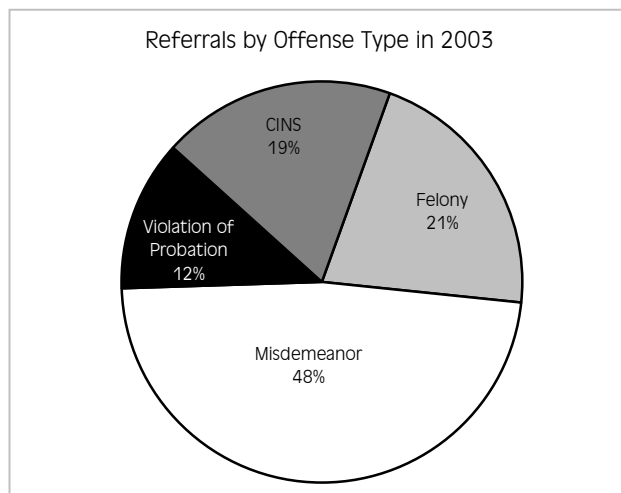
**Offense Distribution**

As illustrated in the chart below, less than a quarter (21%) of the referrals in 2003 were for alleged felony offenses. The number of violent felony offense referrals decreased from 6,474 in 2002 to 6,260 in 2003. Within this category, homicide, robbery, and sexual assault referrals decreased 17%, 11%, and 5% respectively from 2002. The number of aggravated assault referrals remained relatively stable.

The category of misdemeanor A & B violations (which also includes contempt of magistrate orders) has remained relatively consistent as a percent of total referrals over the past three years. Nearly half (48%) of all referrals in 2003 were for these alleged, non-felony delinquent offenses.

Violation of probation order referrals increased slightly as a percentage of total referrals, although the actual number of violations of probation decreased from 13,397 in 2002 to 13,273 in 2003.

The number of CINS offense referrals decreased 1.4%, from 20,508 in 2002 to 20,215 in 2003. As a percent of the total number of referrals, CINS offense referrals have consistently decreased over the past three years.

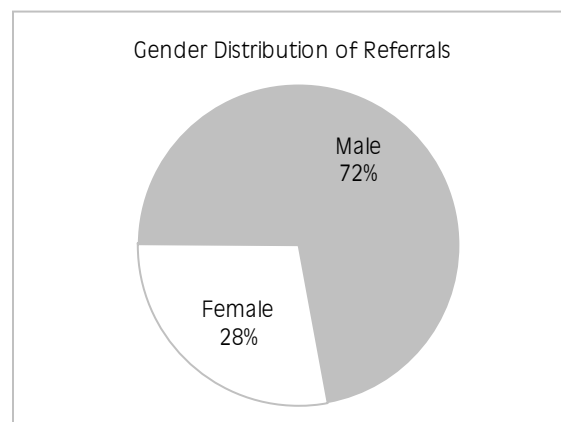
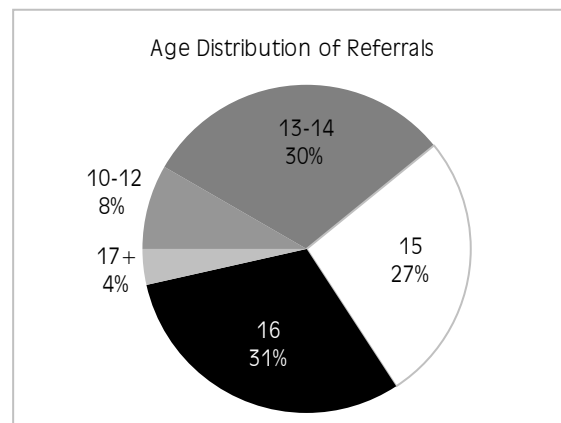
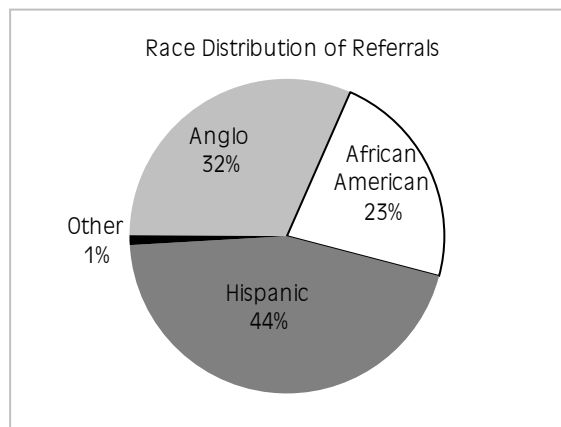
## Profile of Offenders

More than 72% of all referrals in 2003 were male. The proportion of female offenders has gradually increased over the years – 24% in 1992 compared to 28% in 2003. Females comprised a larger percentage of the less severe offenses. Females committed 25% of all delinquent offenses and 45% of all CINS offenses.

While Anglo youth make up 43% of the state's juvenile population, they accounted for only 32% of referrals to juvenile probation departments. Hispanic juveniles were the second most populous group (40%) but accounted for 44% of referrals to probation in 2003. African American youth constituted 13% of the population and 23% of the referrals.

The average age of juveniles referred in 2003 was 14½ years of age. However, 16-year-old youths were referred to juvenile probation more frequently than any other age group.

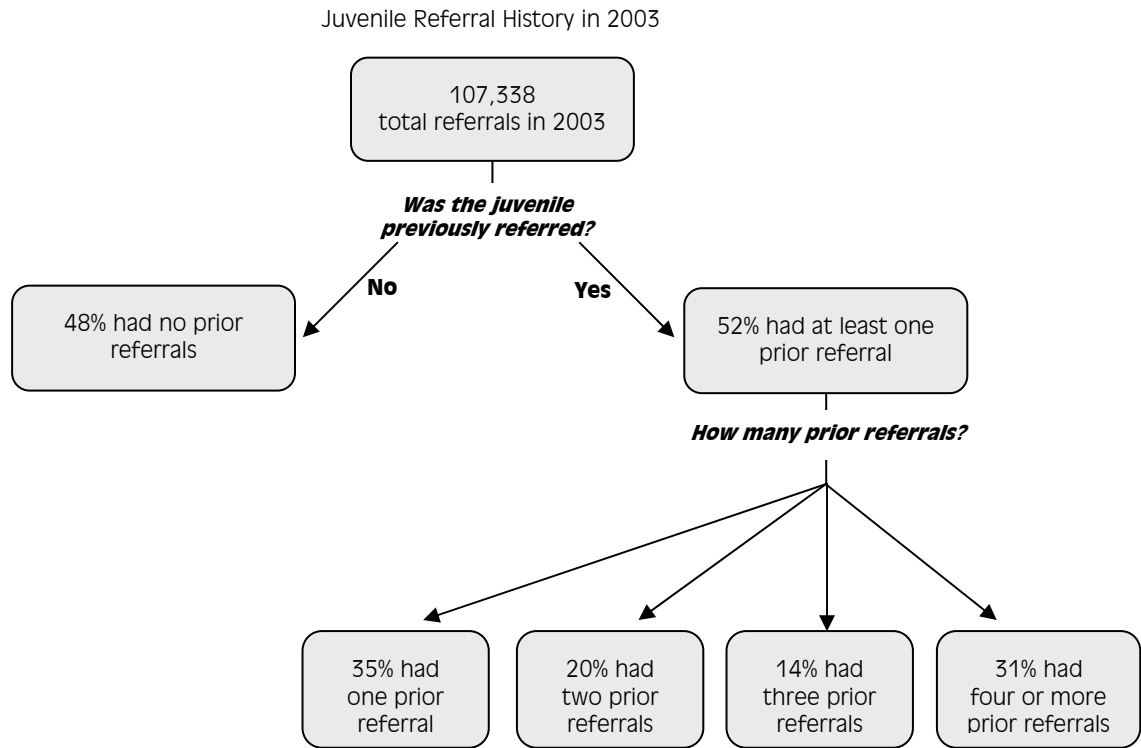
More than eight out of ten juveniles referred were attending regular school or home schooled at the time of referral. The remaining juveniles were in an alternative education centers, had been suspended or expelled, or had dropped out of school entirely.





**Referral Rates**

The average referral rate in 2003 for Texas juvenile probation departments was 44.4 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population. The average felony referral rate in 2003 was 10.8 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population, with a range from zero to 54.



**Referral History**

More than half of the juveniles referred in 2003, 52% had been referred to juvenile probation previously (as illustrated in the diagram above), with 27% having a prior adjudicated by the courts and 1% having a prior commitment to the TYC.

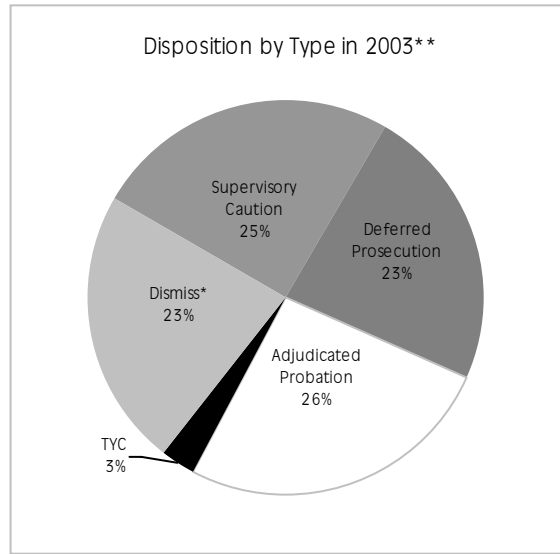
Of juveniles with a prior referrals, 42% had a felony as the most severe offense in their referral history, 43% had a misdemeanor A or B offense as the most serious offense (includes probation violations), and 15% had a CINS offense as the most serious offense.



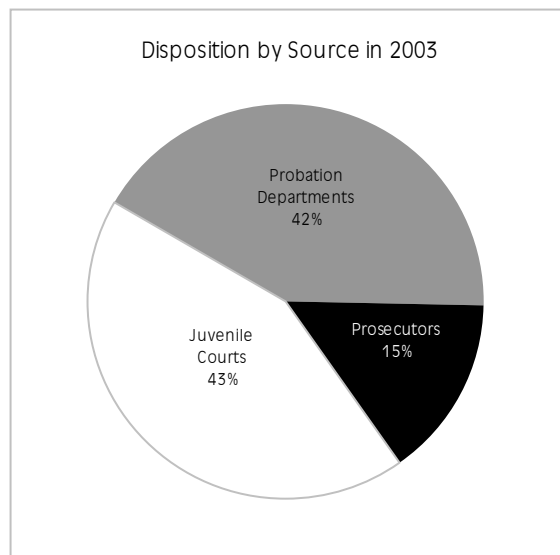
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## Juvenile Disposition and Supervision Activity in 2003

Dispositions were made in 107,824 juvenile cases in calendar year 2003. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 45,086 (42%) of these cases, with 7,684 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 23,167 cases given supervisory caution, and 14,235 cases placed on deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 16,147 (15%) cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,125 cases with supervisory caution and 5,226 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 3,162 referrals, while 6,634 were refused and non-suited.

The remaining 46,591 (43%) cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution for 999 cases, deferred prosecution for 3,877 cases, adjudicated new or modified probation in 26,423 cases, certified and transferred to adult court 139 cases, adjudicated and committed to TYC 2,519 cases (2,358 with indeterminate sentences and 161 with determinate sentences). An additional 12,634 cases were consolidated, transferred, dismissed or found not guilty.



### Distribution of Dispositions by Offense Severity and Race

In general, dispositions varied by the severity of the offense. As shown in the table titled *Dispositions by Offense Severity in 2003* offenses, more serious offenses tended to be disposed to more formal sanctions. Felony and violation of probation had a much higher proportion of adjudications to probation and commitments to the TYC than did misdemeanor A and B offenses. CINS offenses on the other hand had the highest proportion of supervisory caution dispositions.

The next table, *Dispositions by Race in 2003*, illustrates that a higher proportion of Anglo juveniles received supervisory caution and deferred prosecution dispositions than did Hispanic and African American juveniles. A higher proportion of African American juveniles were disposed to probation and TYC than were Hispanic or Anglo juveniles.

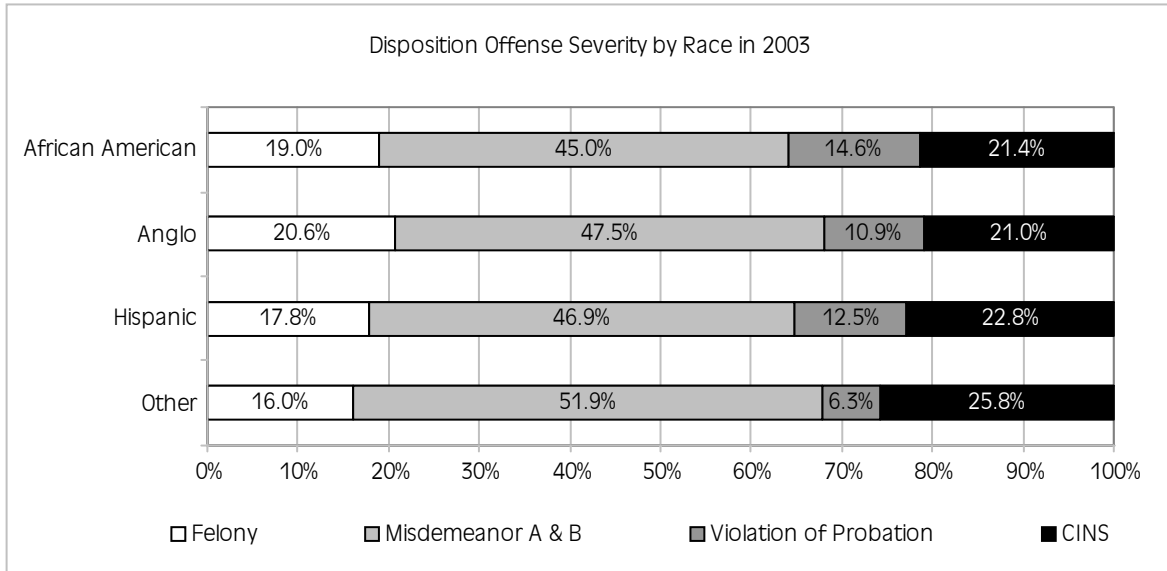

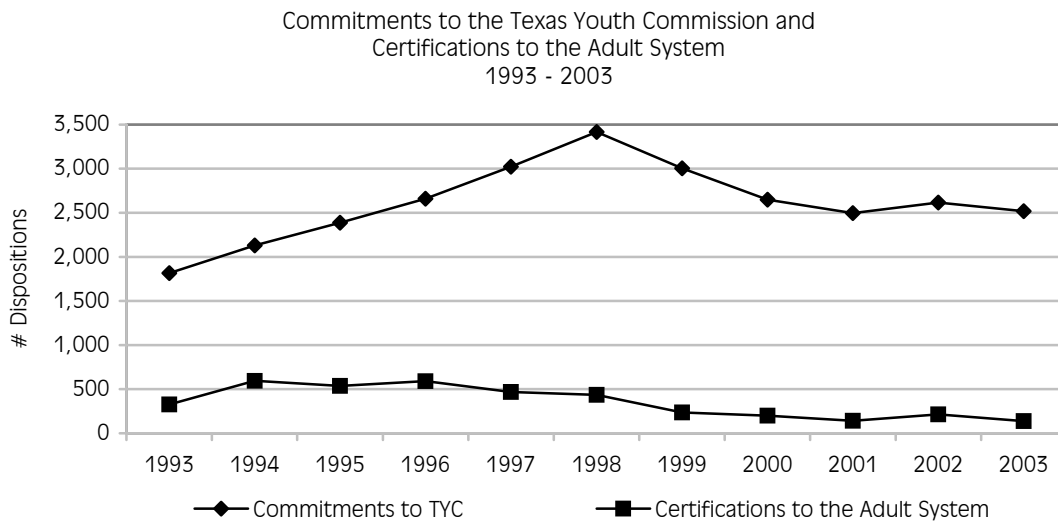
Additional information regarding the difference in dispositions among racial groups may be seen in *Disposition Offense Severity by Race in 2003*. A higher percentage (33.6%) of African American youth were disposed for felony and violation of probation offenses than Anglo and Hispanic youth. Anglo and Hispanic youth were disposed for a higher percentage of the misdemeanor A & B and CINS offenses.



**Beyond Juvenile Probation**

The number of juveniles certified to stand trial as an adult decreased 35% from 214 in 2002 to 139 in 2003. During the same period, a decrease of 3.7% occurred in the number of commitments to TYC. In 2003, 2,519 referrals (2.5% of total referrals) were disposed to TYC, compared to 2,615 referrals (2.6% of total referrals) disposed to TYC in 2002.

The chart below illustrates the number of juveniles committed to the Texas Youth Commission and the number of certifications to the adult system since 1993.

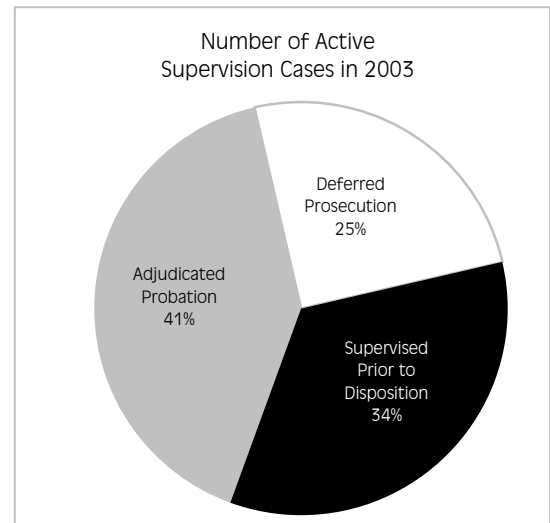


### Supervision Workload Activity

On January 1, 2003, there were 38,249 juveniles receiving active supervision from juvenile probation departments. These juveniles accounted for 41,637 cases under supervision. During the year, 29,736 adjudicated probations, 24,340 deferred prosecutions, and 39,587 conditional releases and other pre-disposition monitoring cases were added for a total of 93,663 new supervisions. As illustrated below at the beginning of the year, nearly half (41%) of active supervision cases were adjudicated probation.

On average, there were 23,002 juveniles on adjudicated probation per day during calendar 2003. These juveniles were supervised for an average of 318 days. During 2003, 3,958 (14%) of the 28,737 supervisions leaving adjudicated probation were unsuccessful in their completion of their supervision. These probationers were either committed to TYC, transferred to an adult court for trial, absconded and did not return to the supervision, or terminated early due to persistent non-compliance to supervision requirements.

The average daily population of juveniles on deferred prosecution during 2003 was 10,735. These juveniles were supervised for an average of 175 days. Of the 23,965 supervisions leaving deferred prosecution, 4,168 (17%) were unsuccessful in their completion of their supervision. These juveniles were unsuccessful for the same reasons as the adjudicated probationers, or they were court-ordered to probation during their deferred prosecution supervision period.



## Juvenile Detention and Residential Placement Activity in 2003

### Detention Activity

There were 49,814 placements made in the 64 pre-adjudication secure residential or short-term detention (i.e., holdover) facilities during 2003. On average, 1,526 youth were securely detained each day of the year.

These youth were detained for an average of 11.19 days. 30% of all juveniles securely detained were released in less than one day while 28% were detained for more than ten days.

### Residential Placement Activity

A total of 9,632 out-of-home residential placements were made during 2003. The placements were made in both secure and non-secure residential facilities but did not include secure pre-adjudication or holdover facility placements. The average daily population of the juveniles in residential placement was 2,983, with an average cost of \$88.24 per day.

### Registry of Secure Facilities

TJPC maintains a statewide registry for all public and private secure juvenile detention and secure placement facilities in Texas. The statewide registry functions as a database of information about each of these facilities operating in the state. Under the Texas Family Code, no child may be placed into a secure detention or secure placement facility that is not registered with TJPC. The table below shows the number, types and available bed space of facilities listed in the 2004 Secure Facilities Registry (data reflects calendar year 2003).

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## Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology

**Active Cases** - cases detained, placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

**Adjudicated Probation** - after going to court for an adjudication hearing on the facts, a judge may order this form of community-based supervision for a specified period of time, based on such reasonable and lawful terms as the court may determine. While on adjudicated probation, the offender may be required to participate in any program deemed appropriate, such as an intensive supervision program or residential placement.

**Average Daily Population** - average number of active juveniles detained, placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

**Average Length of Stay** - average number of days completed cases spent in detention, on placement or under supervision during a specified period of time.

**Certification as Adult** - situation wherein the juvenile court waives its jurisdiction so that an accused juvenile felony offender can be prosecuted as an adult. Certification is permissive and not mandatory under Texas law. Depending upon the type of felony committed, a juvenile as young as 14 years of age can be certified to stand trial as an adult.

**Child/Juvenile** - in Texas, a person who is 10 years of age or older and under 17 years of age or a person who is 17 years of age or older and under 18 years of age who is alleged or found to have engaged in delinquent conduct or CINS as a result of acts committed before becoming 17 years of age.

**Commitment** - a juvenile committed to the care, control and custody of the Texas Youth Commission (TYC). All commitments to the TYC, except under the determinate sentencing act, are for an indeterminate term not to extend beyond the juvenile's 21st birthday.

**Conditional Release From Detention** - juvenile released from detention or from the department's custody under written orders of conditional release. Most conditional releases are done at the time of the detention hearing or under authorization from the judge. The conditions should be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary to ensure the juvenile will return to court.

**Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS)** - public intoxication, truancy, running away from home, fineable only offenses that have been transferred to a juvenile court from a municipal or justice court, inhalant abuse, expulsion for violating a school disciplinary code.

**Deferred Prosecution** - a voluntary alternative to adjudication where the child, parent/guardian(s), prosecutor and the juvenile probation department agree upon probation conditions. Deferred prosecution can last up to six months and can be extended an additional six month by the court. If the child violates any of the deferred conditions, the department may elect to proceed with formal court adjudication.

**Delinquent Conduct** - violation of any law punishable by incarceration (except traffic laws), contempt of magistrate orders, D.W.I. and other related offenses and third offense driving under the influence of alcohol by a minor.

**Department** - a juvenile probation department organized and delivering services in one or more counties and supervised by one or more juvenile boards.

**Detention** - any secure public or private residential facility that is used for the temporary placement of a juvenile accused of having committed an offense, any non-offender, or any other individual accused of having committed a criminal offense.

**Determinate Commitment** - sentence imposed on a juvenile offender for up to 40 years. The juvenile will first serve time in TYC but may later be transferred to adult prison and become subject to adult parole laws. A determinate sentence is only available for certain types of felony offenses.



**Intensive Supervision Program (ISP)** – a program that is a means of diverting juvenile offenders from committal to the Texas Youth Commission. Services provided vary from department to department, but common elements include small caseloads supervised by specially trained probation officers and more frequent contacts between the juvenile and his or her probation officer.

**Juvenile Board** - a body established by law to provide juvenile probation services to a county or counties.

**Juvenile Court** - a court designated under Section 51.04 of the Texas Family Code, or by other law, to exercise jurisdiction over proceedings under Title 3 of the Texas Family Code.

**Program** - a non-residential, department-operated or contracted/purchased-service delivery that is conducted over a period of time (i.e., more than one day or a one-time event). A program must have a measurable or reportable objective and outcome. A program serves children who are on some type of supervision. (Does not include detention and out-of-home placement.)

**Referral (also called Formal Referral)** - any occasion when all three of the following conditions exist: (1) delinquent conduct, conduct indicating a need for supervision, or violation of probation was allegedly committed; (2) the juvenile probation department has jurisdiction and venue; and (3) either (a) face-to-face contact occurs with the office or official designated by the juvenile board or (b) written or verbal authorization to detain is given by the office or official designated by the juvenile board.

**Residential Placement** - placement of a child in a non-secure facility (i.e., foster homes, alcohol and drug treatment facilities, halfway houses, MHMR facilities, etc.) or a secure facility (i.e., boot camps, secure county, state, or private facilities, etc.) either with or without a court proceeding.

**Status Offenses** - juvenile offenses that are not criminal when committed by adults such as runaway or truancy.

**Supervisory Caution** - descriptive term for a wide variety of summary, non-judicial dispositions that may be made in a case. This may include referral of the child to a social agency or a community based first offender program run by law enforcement, contacting parents to inform them of the child's activities, or simply warning the child about his or her activities.
