I. GRANT DESCRIPTION.

- A. The Local Post-Adjudication Fund is a grant designed to provide funds to select local juvenile probation departments to help defray the cost of operating 19 secure post-adjudication correctional facilities constructed beginning in 1996 using funds from the State of Texas general obligation bond proceeds. The grant also allows regionally-operated facilities to provide reduced rates to counties that place juveniles in these facilities.

II. GRANT SPECIFIC DEFINITIONS.

- A. **Eligible Placement Day.** A placement day that is eligible for payment under the Local Post-Adjudication Fund grant is defined as:

1. The day that a juvenile is admitted into in the facility regardless of the time of day;
2. Each day or partial day a juvenile is present in a qualified placement facility at least during all or part of the non-program hours (e.g., sleeping hours); and
3. The day a juvenile is discharged as long as the juvenile is discharged after 12:00 p.m. and was present at least during all or part of the non-program hours (e.g., sleeping hours).

- B. **Qualified Local Secure Post-Adjudication Correctional Facilities (Qualified Facility).** A secure post-adjudication correctional facility that was built in whole or in part with grant funds from the State of Texas. These facilities include the following:

III. PERFORMANCE MEASURES.

- A. **Goal.** The goal of this grant is to reduce delinquency, increase offender accountability and rehabilitate juvenile offenders through a comprehensive, coordinated, community-based juvenile probation system.
- B. **Program Objective.** The objective of this grant is to increase the number of community placement alternatives for juvenile probation offenders.
- C. **Program Performance.** Grantee performance under the grant shall be determined using the following measure:
 1. Total number of placement days in a qualified facility.

IV. PROGRAMMATIC COMPONENTS.

- A. **Operation of Qualified Facilities.** The Grantee shall operate the qualified facility in accordance with the main construction bond funding agreement entitled *Agreement for Construction and Operation of Secure Post-Adjudication Juvenile Facility* executed between the Grantee, the County Commissioner's Court and the Commission prior to the awarding of the original grant funds used for the construction of the qualified facility.
- B. **Payment Amount.** The Grantee shall be eligible to receive payment funds from this grant for all eligible placement days in an amount not to exceed the total as authorized in the State Financial Assistance Contract in Paragraph 4.1.4.3. The Grantee shall be paid the amount of \$21.25 per eligible placement day for each juvenile offender placed in the qualified facility as long as funds are available. Any funds unexpended at the end of each fiscal year of the grant period shall be reallocated to those counties in which funds were exhausted before the end of each fiscal year of the grant period. The reallocation shall be calculated in the same manner as the original allocation. If the Grantee contracts with other juvenile probation departments that place offenders in the qualified facility, the Grantee shall reduce the daily rate by \$21.25.
- C. **Target Population.** Subject to Section IV (B), a juvenile's placement is eligible for payment under this grant if the juvenile has been adjudicated and court ordered by a Texas juvenile court into a qualified facility.

Funds may be temporarily suspended if a *Quarterly ISP and Residential Cost Report* is not received by the due date.
- C. **Monthly Reports.** The Grantee shall submit a completed *Local Post-Adjudication Fund Payment Request Form* [TJPC-FIS-30-04] monthly to the Commission for payment under this grant. The Grantee shall certify both the number of eligible juvenile offenders served and the number of eligible placement days each juvenile offender was served for the month for which payment is claimed.
