

## Behavioral Health Services

### Behavioral Health Treatments and Non-Residential Services

#### **BH Services Screen**

The behavioral health services tab should be used to record mental health, substance abuse, trauma and intellectual disability/MR referrals and services provided to juveniles under the jurisdiction of the juvenile probation department. Behavioral health services are one-time events, not associated with a program, which provide help, assistance or support to a juvenile with a suspected or confirmed behavioral health need.

Examples of BH Services:

- Purchasing medication to address a behavioral health diagnosis
- One-time counseling session to treat a juvenile's short term behavioral health need.
- Doctor visit to determine the need for mental health or substance abuse services.
- Doctor visit to review or issue prescribed behavioral health medication.
- Psychological assessments and evaluations.

#### **BH Treatment Screen**

The behavioral health treatment tab should be used to record mental health, substance abuse, trauma, and intellectual disability/MR treatment provided to juveniles under the jurisdiction of the juvenile probation department. Treatment does not have to be the result of a referral from the juvenile probation department. Behavioral health treatment is care intended for or used to remedy a behavioral health problem. Treatment occurs over time (not a single event), does not have a curriculum, and is not a program.

Examples of BH Treatment:

- Monitoring of behavioral health related prescription, including medication for ADHD.
- A Case Manager responsible for the assessment of need and implementation of care plans.
- Rehabilitative mental health interventions such as basic living skills and self-care skills that are intended to reduce cognitive and behavioral impairments and restore juveniles to their highest level of functioning.

#### **Non-Residential Services Screen**

The non-residential services tab can be used to track services provided by the probation department that are not related to behavioral health.

Examples of Non-Residential Services:

- Non-behavioral health doctor visits
- A one-time, non-behavioral health, counseling session
- Dental Visits
- Purchasing personal items for the juvenile

If a juvenile is participating in counseling as a condition of supervision, the counseling must be entered on the Program Screen. Some counties additionally choose to enter each counseling session a juvenile attends on the Non-Residential Services Screen to track attendance and/or cost per session. While it is okay to track each counseling session as a Non-Residential Service, the Counseling must also be entered as a Program on the Program Screen.
