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Overview

The Texas Juvenile Probation Commission's (TJPC) annual activity report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile criminal activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to assist the state's effort to improve the juvenile justice system and reduce juvenile crime in Texas.

During calendar year 2002, police agencies in Texas processed 140,085 arrests of juveniles between the ages of 10 and 17. Of this number, 58,860 were warned and released, handled in justice and municipal courts, or diverted, and 81,225 were referred to juvenile probation departments. Social service agencies, parents, schools, and the Texas Youth Commission (TYC) referred another 24,685 cases, for a total of 105,910 referrals to juvenile probation departments.

This is a decrease of 7,224 (6.4%) total referrals from the previous year, representing the seventh consecutive decrease of referrals in Texas. Total delinquent offenses decreased nearly 4% from 2001; however, within the delinquent category, violent offense referrals increased 2%. Violation of probation referrals decreased 2%, and CINS offense referrals decreased 17%.

All of the 254 counties in Texas were served through 164 juvenile probation departments in 2002. These departments were staffed by a total of 6,922 employees, 2,021 of whom carried a probation caseload.

Counties registered and operated 49 secure pre-adjudication residential facilities, six holdover facilities, and 29 secure post-adjudication residential facilities in 2002. In addition to the county-operated facilities, private contractors provided services for

juveniles in nine pre-adjudication facilities, one holdover facility, and 14 post-adjudication secure facilities. These facilities provided a combined total of 2,299 pre-adjudication, 62 holdover, and 2,318 post-adjudication beds.

In 2002, 49,898 juveniles were held in secure detention facilities prior to adjudication hearings. Approximately 30% of those detained were released in less than one day. An additional 9,864 placements were made to residential facilities, generally following the disposition.


Dispositions were made in 107,615 juvenile cases in calendar year 2002. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 45,677 of these cases, with 8,073 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 23,519 cases given supervisory caution, and 14,085 cases placed on deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 16,181 cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,463 cases with supervisory caution and 4,495 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 2,826 referrals, while 7,397 were refused and non-suited.

The remaining 45,757 cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution to 764 cases; ordered deferred prosecution to 3,757 cases; adjudicated new or modified probation to 27,456 cases; certified and transferred to adult court 214 cases; adjudicated and committed to TYC 2,615 cases (2,464 with indeterminate sentences and 151 with determinate sentences); and consolidated, transferred, dismissed, or found not guilty 10,951 cases.

Texas Juvenile Probation System

Introduction

TJPC collects statistical data relating to juveniles referred to the juvenile justice system from the 164 probation departments covering all Texas counties. Beginning January 1999, each department was required to submit individual case file data in an electronic format, replacing the aggregate reporting methods used in previous years. In addition, TJPC periodically surveys the departments to obtain supplemental information.

Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from the statistics. The data portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics.

At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics and should be considered when evaluating them:

1. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Emphasis is placed on the rehabilitation of the juvenile through accountability, guidance, counseling, diversion, and treatment. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as *supervisory caution* or *dismissed or otherwise disposed*, in fact occasion rehabilitative efforts on the part of the juvenile probation system.
2. A number of the juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies.

3. Juvenile probation officers in multi-county departments spend more time traveling than do officers in single-county jurisdictions.

Juvenile Boards

State law requires each county to have a juvenile board. Some of these boards govern multiple counties. Each board, consisting of district and county judges, is responsible for overseeing the operations of the juvenile justice system in that county, which includes designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer, and setting the policy and budget for the juvenile probation department. TJPC provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.

Funding. TJPC is the primary agency through which state funding for juvenile justice is channeled to the counties. During fiscal year 2002, TJPC sent more than 132 million dollars to county juvenile boards for their local probation departments. Total revenues appropriated to TJPC increased over eighteen percent from the year before, from \$115,214,018 in fiscal year 2001 to \$136,337,617 in fiscal year 2002.

State funds accounted for about 28 percent of total funding for juvenile probation in fiscal year 2002. Local commissioners courts provided approximately 63 percent of the total from county revenues. Juvenile boards work closely with the commissioners courts to set budgets for the operation of the local juvenile probation departments using both local and state funds. The remaining nine percent of funds was from federal and other entities.



Juvenile Probation Departments

Structure. Juvenile probation departments implement the policies of juvenile boards and deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts. There are 120 single-county departments and 44 multi-county departments in Texas. Multi-county departments range from two to six counties. While 18 departments served both adult and juvenile probationers in 2002, 15 of these combined departments used separate juvenile probation officers.

Certification of Officers. TJPC requires that all Texas juvenile probation, detention, and corrections officers be certified as having earned necessary academic degrees and completed 40 hours of approved continuing education annually. Training is provided by TJPC for juvenile

judges and all levels of juvenile probation personnel to count towards the necessary hours of continuing education.

During 2002, TJPC certified 266 new juvenile probation officers, 1,081 detention officers, and 908 corrections child-care workers. An additional 2,263 existing officers were also re-certified.

Salaries and Staffing. Based on data received from local departments in the Annual Resource Report, there were 6,922 salaried personnel in juvenile probation departments across Texas at the end of 2002. This represents 336 more employees than in 2001. Eight of the departments had only one employee (a chief juvenile probation officer). The following table shows the breakdown of department staff and their salaries.

Caseloads. Data received in the Annual Resource Report indicate that the average daily caseload per caseload-carrying officer in Texas juvenile probation departments ranged from one to 73 juveniles, with a statewide average of 28 in 2002. Some departments, primarily larger-sized ones, employ officers that carry specialized caseloads of one specific type of case only. For these specialized officers, the average daily caseload for deferred prosecution cases was 36, adjudicated probation was 30, and intensive supervision probation was 15.

Juvenile Justice and Education.

Juvenile justice alternative education programs – also known as JJAEPs – provide continued education services for youth that have been expelled from the public school system. JJAEPs are mandated in counties with populations of more than 125,000.

In school year 2001/2002, there were 26 mandatory JJAEPs operating in Texas. In addition, seven JJAEPs operated with state grant funds in counties with populations of less than 125,000. Using state funds, the 33 JJAEPs had 7,682 student entries into the programs. Approximately 61% of the students in state-funded programs were expelled from the school districts for discretionary reasons, most commonly for serious or persistent misconduct.

Another 139 youth were served in non-mandated, non-state-funded JJAEPs operated by four juvenile probation departments.

Restitution. Nearly every juvenile probation department utilized both community service restitution and financial

restitution in 2002. More than 39,000 juveniles provided nearly 955,000 hours of community service in response to the offenses for which they were referred. Additionally, more than 12,500 juveniles paid over \$2.55 million statewide in financial restitution.

Substance Abuse Services. Drug or alcohol tests were utilized in nearly all (98%) of the juvenile probation departments and were administered on approximately 54,284 referrals statewide. Substance abuse prevention or counseling services were provided to approximately 13,045 referrals in 2002. At the same time, 4,851 referrals received TCADA-licensed non-residential treatment and 1,637 received TCADA-licensed residential treatment for substance abuse issues.

Departments spent approximately \$17 million on substance abuse treatment services. Still, at least 13,261 referrals needed substance abuse services or treatment but did not receive any due to insufficient resources.

Mental Health Services. Juvenile probation departments indicated on the Annual Resource Report that approximately 27,595 juveniles were in need of mental health services during 2002 (an increase of 42% over the need indicated in 2001). However, during this period, only approximately 14,265 juveniles received mental health services.


Sex Offender Services. During 2002, approximately 372 juveniles received in-patient sex offender treatment, and 1,393 juveniles received out-patient treatment.



Programs. Each juvenile probation department provides at least basic supervision services. Beyond this, however, 150 of the 164 juvenile probation departments also operated additional non-

residential programs to provide services for certain juveniles under supervision. The table below shows the number of juveniles served by programs operated in addition to basic supervision during 2002.



Juvenile Population

The Texas juvenile justice system serves youth between the ages of 10 and 16, and 17 if the offense was committed when the youth was 16 years old or younger. Using the Texas State Data Center projections based on the United States census 2000 population, there were

2,374,797 juveniles in Texas in 2002. Race and age breakdowns of the projected 2002 figures are shown in the table above. The map below illustrates the juvenile population density throughout the state. The appendix of this report contains juvenile population data per county (see Juvenile Referral Activity – County-Specific Details).

Texas Juvenile Population in 2002






Juvenile Referral Activity in 2002






Texas Juvenile Crime Clock – Delinquent Juvenile Crime in 2002



Juvenile Referral Activity

**Referrals vs. Juveniles Referred
1993 - 2002**



There were 105,910 referrals to juvenile probation authorities in Texas, a decrease of 6.4% from 2001. This represents the seventh consecutive annual decrease in total referrals. This decrease occurred while there was a 2.0% increase in the projected juvenile-aged population based on Texas State Data Center projections.


Police agencies made nearly eight out of ten referrals. Schools, parents, social agencies, or other probation departments made most of the remaining referrals.

A youth may be referred to a juvenile probation department for more than one offense in a single referral. In this case, the most serious offense counts as the referral. Referrals in 2002 consisted of 133,814 separate offenses, for an average of 1.3 offenses per referral.

The number of juveniles referred decreased for the sixth consecutive year in 2002, from 78,393 (average of 1.44 referrals per juvenile) in 2001, to 74,643 (average of 1.42 referrals per juvenile) in 2002. The chart above illustrates the number of referrals and the number of individual juveniles referred over the past ten years.

Offense Distribution. As illustrated in the chart above, less than a quarter (22%) of the referrals in 2002 were for alleged felony offenses. The percent of referrals for these offenses has gradually risen since 2000.

The number of violent felony offense referrals increased from 6,344 in 2001 to 6,474 in 2002. Within this category, homicide and sexual assault referrals increased 43% and 10% respectively from 2001. The number of attempted homicide, robbery and aggravated assault referrals remained relatively stable.

The category of misdemeanor A & B violations (which also includes contempt of magistrate orders) has remained relatively

consistent as a percent of total referrals over the past three years. Nearly half (45%) of all referrals in 2002 were for these alleged, non-felony delinquent offenses.

Violation of probation order referrals increased slightly in 2002 as a percentage of total referrals, although the actual number of violations of probation decreased from 13,664 in 2001 to 13,397 in 2002.

The number of CINS offense referrals decreased 17%, from 24,695 in 2001 to 20,508 in 2002. As a percent of the total number of referrals, CINS offense referrals have consistently decreased over the past three years.

Profile of Offenders. More than 71% of all referrals in 2002 were male. The proportion of female offenders has gradually increased over the years – 24% one decade ago to 29% in 2002. Females comprised a larger percentage of the less severe offenses. Females committed 25% of all delinquent offenses and 46% of all CINS offenses.


While Anglo youth make up nearly half (44%) of the juvenile population, they accounted for only 33% of the referrals. Hispanic juveniles were the second most populous group (40%) but accounted for the most referrals in 2002 with 43%. African American youth constituted 13% of the population and 23% of the referrals.

The average age of juvenile referrals was 14½ years of age. However, 16-year-old youths were referred to juvenile probation more frequently than any other age group.


More than half (54%) of the juveniles referred in 2002 were living with one parent – either the mother or the father, and nearly one third (29%) were living with two parents. Most of the remaining youth lived with other relatives, such as grandparents or an aunt and uncle.

More than eight out of ten juveniles referred were attending regular school. The remaining juveniles were in an alternative education center, had been suspended or expelled, or had dropped out of school entirely.


Gender Distribution of Referrals

Age Distribution of Referrals




Referral Rates. The average referral rate in 2002 for Texas juvenile probation departments was 44.6 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population. The average felony referral rate in 2002 was 10.3 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population, with a range from zero to 41.6.

The following map illustrates felony referral rates for 2002 throughout the state.


As illustrated on the map, high felony referral rates occur in all regions of the state.

In 2002, none of the state's seven largest counties were considered to be within the high felony referral rate category. El Paso and Tarrant counties were in the medium-rate group, while Bexar, Dallas, Harris, Hidalgo and Travis counties were in the low-rate group.

Juvenile Referral History in 2002




Referral History. More than half of the referrals (54%) had been referred before (as illustrated in the diagram above), with 26% having been previously adjudicated by the courts and 0.4% having been previously committed to the TYC.

Of those with prior referrals, 42% had a felony as the most severe offense in their referral history; 45% had a misdemeanor A or B offense as the most serious offense; and 13% had a CINS offense as the most serious offense.



2001 Re-Contact with Juvenile Probation Departments




Re-Contact Rates. As illustrated in the chart above, two thirds of the juveniles referred in 2001 did not have a re-contact (i.e., a subsequent referral) within one year. The remaining one third did return within the year with a subsequent referral. This subsequent contact occurred an average of 117 days after the first referral in 2001.

Of those whose first referral in 2001 was for a felony offense, 35% had a re-contact with the probation

department. For misdemeanor A or B offenses, 30% had a re-contact; for violation of probation, 52% had a re-contact; and for CINS offenses, 39% had a re-contact.

When a subsequent referral did occur, slightly more than one-third (38%) of the juveniles were referred with a more serious offense on the initial re-contact; slightly less than one-third (31%) returned with an offense of equal severity; and slightly less than one-third (31%) returned with a less severe offense.

Referral and Population


Projections. The Criminal Justice Policy Council was mandated by the Texas Legislature to project juvenile justice correctional populations. In their report titled "Adult and Juvenile Correctional Population Projections, FY 2003 – FY 2008" (January 2003), juvenile probation referrals were projected to increase 18% to 125,282 by fiscal year 2008 (calendar year projections not available).

This projected increase in referrals is based primarily on the projected increase in the juvenile-aged population. According to the Texas State Data Center, the juvenile

population in Texas is expected to increase significantly. The population projection between 2002 and 2008 is expected to increase nearly 6%, from 2,374,797 to 2,516,898.

The following chart illustrates past referral and population data with the Criminal Justice Policy Council's referral projections and juvenile population projections for the next six years. Historically, referrals peaked in 1995 when there were 133,866 referrals to juvenile probation departments.


Juvenile Disposition and Supervision Activity in 2002







Distribution of Dispositions by Offense Severity and Race. In general, dispositions varied logically with the severity of the offense. As evidenced in the table titled *Dispositions by Offense Severity in 2002* on the previous page, a high proportion of CINS offenses (58%) received a supervisory caution disposition. The more serious offense categories of felony and violation of probation had a much higher proportion of probation and commitments to the TYC than did CINS and misdemeanor A and B offense categories.

The next table, *Dispositions by Race in 2002*, illustrates that a higher proportion of Anglo juveniles received supervisory caution and deferred prosecution

dispositions than did Hispanic and African American juveniles. A higher proportion of African American juveniles were disposed to probation and TYC than were Hispanic or Anglo juveniles.

Additional information regarding the difference in dispositions among racial groups may be seen in *Disposition Offense Severity by Race in 2002*. A higher percentage (36%) of African American youth received dispositions for the more serious offense categories of felony and violation of probation. Anglo and Hispanic youth made up a higher percentage of the less serious offense categories of misdemeanor A & B and CINS.



Beyond Juvenile Probation. The number of juveniles certified to stand trial as an adult increased 52% from 141 in 2001 to 214 in 2002.


During the same period, an increase in both the number of commitments to TYC (increase of 4.7%) and the rate of TYC commitments as a percentage of total referrals (increase of 11.8%) occurred. In 2002, juvenile courts committed 2,615

referrals (2.5% of total referrals) to TYC, compared to 2,498 referrals (2.2% of total referrals) in 2001.

This was the first year since 1998 that an increase in commitments to TYC occurred.

The chart below illustrates the number of juveniles committed to the Texas Youth Commission and the number of certifications to the adult system in the past decade.

Supervision Workload Activity


On January 1, 2002, there were 42,802 cases of juveniles receiving active supervision from juvenile probation departments. During the year, 28,686 adjudicated probations, 23,459 deferred prosecutions, and 37,897 conditional releases and other pre-disposition monitoring cases were added for a total of 90,042 new supervisions. As illustrated below, nearly half (41%) of active supervision cases were adjudicated probation.

On average, there were 25,761 juveniles on adjudicated probation per day during 2002. These juveniles were supervised for an average of 313 days each. During 2002, 4,171 (14%) of the 28,999 supervisions leaving adjudicated probation were unsuccessful in their completion of

their supervision. These probationers were either committed to TYC, transferred to an adult criminal trial, absconded and did not return to the supervision, or terminated early due to persistent non-compliance to supervision requirements.

The average daily population of supervisions of deferred prosecution during 2002 was 10,640. These juveniles were each supervised for an average of 155 days. Of the 23,900 supervisions leaving deferred prosecution, 4,257 (18%) were unsuccessful in their completion of their supervision. These juveniles were unsuccessful for the same reasons as the adjudicated probationers, or they were court-ordered to probation during their deferred prosecution supervision period.

Juvenile Detention and Residential Placement Activity

Detention Activity. There were 49,898 placements made in the 65 pre-adjudication secure residential or short-term detention (i.e., holdover) facilities during 2002. On average, 1,930 youth were securely detained each day of the year in a Texas facility.

These youth were detained for an average of 12.9 days. Approximately 30% of all juveniles securely detained were released in less than one day; 29% were detained for more than ten days.

Residential Placement Activity. A total of 9,864 out-of-home residential placements were made during 2002. The placements were made in both secure and non-secure residential facilities but did not include secure pre-adjudication or holdover facility placements. These juveniles were placed for an average of 99 days at an average cost of \$83.77 per day.

Counties without residential placement funds are forced to seek out alternatives to residential placements, such

as finding free placements in the private sector or committing juveniles who need to be removed from their homes to the TYC. According to the Annual Resource Report, approximately 406 juveniles were denied access to residential placement due to insufficient resources, such as funding or available bed space, in 2002.


Registry of Secure Facilities. TJPC maintains a statewide registry for all public and private secure juvenile detention and correctional facilities in Texas. The statewide registry functions as a database of information about each of these facilities operating in the state. Under the Texas Family Code, no child shall be placed into a secure detention or correctional facility that is not registered with TJPC. The table below shows the number, types and available bed space of facilities listed in the 2003 Secure Facilities Registry (data reflects calendar year 2002). The map on the following page illustrates the location of the registered facilities.

Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology





Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology

Active Cases - cases detained, placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

Adjudicated Probation - after going to court for an adjudication hearing on the facts, a judge may order this form of community-based supervision for a specified period of time, based on such reasonable and lawful terms as the court may determine. While on adjudicated probation, the offender may be required to participate in any program deemed appropriate, such as an intensive supervision program or residential placement.

Average Daily Population - average number of active juveniles detained, placed or supervised for a specified period of time.

Average Length of Stay - average number of days completed cases spent in detention, on placement or under supervision for a specified period of time.

Certification as Adult - situation wherein the juvenile court waives its jurisdiction so that an accused juvenile felony offender can be prosecuted as an adult. Certification is permissive and not mandatory under Texas law. Depending upon the type of felony committed, a juvenile as young as either 14 or 15 years of age can be certified to stand trial as an adult.

Child/Juvenile - in Texas, a person who is 10 years of age or older and under 17 years of age or a person who is 17 years of age or older and under 18 years of age who is alleged or found to have engaged in delinquent conduct or CINS as a result of acts committed before becoming 17 years of age.

Commitment - a child committed to the care, control and custody of the Texas Youth Commission (TYC). All commitments to the TYC, except under the determinate sentencing act, are for an indeterminate term not to extend beyond the child's 21st birthday.

Conditional Release From Detention - juvenile released from detention or from the department's custody under written orders of conditional release. Most conditional releases are done at the time of the detention hearing or under authorization from the judge. The conditions should be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary to ensure the juvenile will return to court.

Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS) - public intoxication, truancy, running away from home, fineable only offenses that have been transferred to a juvenile court from a municipal or justice court, inhalant abuse, expulsion for violating a school disciplinary code, or a violation of a court order under the Services to At Risk Youth Programs.

Deferred Prosecution - a voluntary alternative to adjudication where the child, parent/guardian(s), prosecutor and the juvenile probation department agree upon probation conditions. Deferred prosecution can last up to six months. If the child violates any of the probation conditions, the state may elect to proceed with formal court adjudication.

Delinquent Conduct - violation of any law punishable by incarceration (except traffic laws), violation of juvenile court orders entered under Section 54.04 or 54.05 of the Texas Family Code (except by truancy, running away, or fineable only offenses), contempt of magistrate orders, D.W.I. and other related offenses and third offense driving under the influence of alcohol by a minor.

Department - a juvenile probation department organized and delivering services in one or more counties and supervised by one or more juvenile boards.

Detention - any secure public or private residential facility that is used for the temporary placement of a juvenile accused of having committed an offense, any non-offender, or any other individual accused of having committed a criminal offense.



Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology (continued)

Determinate Commitment - sentence imposed on a juvenile offender for up to 40 years. The juvenile will first serve time in TYC but may later be transferred to adult prison and become subject to adult parole laws. A determinate sentence is only available for certain types of felony offenses.

Disposition - after adjudication where the judge decides what probation conditions will be imposed upon the child (and the child's family) or whether to commit the child to the Texas Youth Commission.

Intensive Supervision Program (ISP) - type of probation that is a cost-effective means of diverting juvenile offenders from committal to the Texas Youth Commission. Services provided vary from department to department, but common elements include reduced caseloads by specially trained probation officers and more frequent contacts between the juvenile and his or her probation officer.

Juvenile Board - a body established by law to provide juvenile probation services to a county or counties.

Juvenile Court - a court designated under Section 51.04 of the Texas Family Code, or by other law, to exercise jurisdiction over proceedings under Title 3 of the Texas Family Code.

Program - a non-residential, department-operated or contracted/purchased-service delivery that is conducted over a period of time (i.e., more than one day or a one-time event). A program must have a measurable or reportable objective and outcome. A program serves children who are on some type of supervision. (Does not include detention and out-of-home placement.)

Referral (also called Formal Referral) - any occasion when all three of the following conditions exist: (1) delinquent conduct, conduct indicating a need for supervision, or violation of probation was allegedly committed; (2) the juvenile probation department has jurisdiction and venue; and (3) either (a) face-to-face contact occurs with the office or official designated by the juvenile board or (b) written or verbal authorization to detain is given by the office or official designated by the juvenile board.

Residential Placement - placement of child in a non-secure facility (i.e., foster homes, alcohol and drug treatment facilities, halfway houses, MHMR facilities, etc.) or a secure facility (i.e., boot camps, secure county, state, or private facilities, etc.) either with or without a court proceeding.

Status Offenses - juvenile offenses that are not criminal when committed by adults; e.g. runaway or truancy.

Successful Outcome of Supervision - the completion of the period of supervision without any of the following situations: 1) the juvenile has further court action resulting in commitment to TYC or certification to stand trial as an adult; 2) the juvenile has additional charges being filed as an adult which result in termination of juvenile court supervision; 3) the child absconds and is not returned to supervision; 4) the child's death is a direct result of subsequent criminal conduct; 5) early termination of supervision by the court results from persistent non-compliance to program requirements and refusal to accept services; 6) while under supervision, the child is re-arrested or commits a technical violation and the original supervision is terminated. The outcome of the original supervision is unsuccessful. If, however, the supervision is modified, no outcome should be determined until the modified period of supervision has been completed.

Supervisory Caution - descriptive term for a wide variety of summary, non-judicial dispositions that intake may make of a case. This may include referral of the child to a social agency or a community based first offender program run by law enforcement, contacting parents to inform them of the child's activities, or simply warning the child about his or her activities.
