Statistical and Other Data on the Juvenile Justice System in Texas for Calendar Year 2005

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Overview

The Texas Juvenile Probation Commission's (TJPC) annual activity report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile criminal activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to assist the state's effort to improve the juvenile justice system and reduce juvenile crime in Texas.

During calendar year 2005, police agencies in Texas processed 141,113 arrests of juveniles between the ages of 10 and 16. Of this number, 63,926 were warned and released, handled in justice and municipal courts, or diverted and 77,187 were referred to juvenile probation departments. Social service agencies, parents, schools, and the Texas Youth Commission (TYC) referred another 25,186 cases, for a total of 102,373 referrals to juvenile probation departments.

This is a decrease of 5,421 (5%) referrals from calendar year 2004. Delinquent offenses decreased 3% from 2004; within the delinquent category, violent felony offense referrals decreased 4%. Violation of probation referrals decreased 2.7%, and misdemeanor offense referrals decreased 3.1%.

The 254 counties in Texas were served through 169 juvenile probation departments in 2005. These departments were staffed by a total of 7,678 employees, 1,928 of whom carried a probation caseload.

Counties registered and operated 56 secure pre-adjudication residential facilities, six holdover facilities, and 43 secure post-adjudication residential facilities in 2005. In addition to the county-operated facilities, private contractors provided services for juveniles in five pre-adjudication facilities, one holdover facility, and 9 post-adjudication secure facilities. These facilities provided a combined total of 2,649 pre-adjudication, 39 holdover, and 2,401 post-adjudication beds.

In 2005, 50,131 juveniles were held in secure detention facilities prior to adjudication hearings. Approximately 21.3% of those detained were released in less than one day. An additional 10,432 placements were made to residential facilities, generally following the juvenile's disposition.

Dispositions were made in 104,162 juvenile cases in calendar year 2005. Disposition of a case may result from action taken by the juvenile department, the juvenile prosecutor or the juvenile court.

Juvenile probation departments disposed of 40,783

of these cases, with 6,970 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 20,049 cases given supervisory caution, and 13,764 cases given deferred prosecution.


Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 15,844 cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,151 cases with supervisory caution and 4,763 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 3,154 referrals, while 6,776 were refused or non-suited.

The remaining 47,535 cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution to 908 cases; ordered deferred prosecution to 4,767 cases; adjudicated new or modified probation to 26,859 cases; certified and transferred to adult court 178 kids; adjudicated and committed to TYC 2,665 kids (2,495 with indeterminate sentences and 170 with determinate sentences); and consolidated, transferred, dismissed, or found not guilty 12,158 cases.

Dispositions most often resulted in supervision for the juvenile. In 2005, 28% of cases were disposed to probation while 24% were disposed to deferred prosecution. 23% percent of cases were disposed with a supervisory caution and 22% were dismissed, found not guilty, transferred. Less than 3% of dispositions resulted in commitment to TYC or certification as adult. Data does not include 7,644 consolidated dispositions

Texas Juvenile Probation System in 2005

Introduction

TJPC collects statistical data relating to juveniles referred to the juvenile justice system from all counties in the state. Beginning January 1999, each department was required to submit individual case file data in an electronic format, replacing the aggregate reporting methods used in previous years. In addition, TJPC periodically surveys the departments to obtain supplemental information.

Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from the statistics. The data portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics.

At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics and should be considered when evaluating them:

1. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Emphasis is placed on the rehabilitation of the juvenile through accountability, guidance, counseling, diversion, and treatment. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as *supervisory caution* or *dismissed* or *otherwise disposed*, have received rehabilitative and other services from of the juvenile probation system.
2. A number of the juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies.
3. Juvenile probation officers in multi-county departments may spend more time traveling than do officers in single-county jurisdictions.

Juvenile Boards

State law requires each county to have a juvenile board. Some of these boards govern multiple counties. Each board, consisting of district and county judges, is responsible for overseeing the operation of the juvenile justice system in that county. This includes designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer and setting the policy and budget for the juvenile probation department. TJPC provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.

Funding. TJPC is the primary agency through which state funding for juvenile justice is channeled to the counties. During fiscal year 2005, TJPC sent more than 133 million dollars to county juvenile boards for their local probation departments. Total revenues passed through to departments in 2005 increased one percent from the previous year, from \$131,855,362 in fiscal year 2004 to \$133,189,342 in fiscal year 2005.

State funds accounted for approximately 30 percent of total funding for juvenile probation services in fiscal year 2005. Local commissioners courts provided approximately 60 percent of the total from county revenues. Juvenile boards work closely with the commissioners court to set budgets for operation of local juvenile probation departments using both local and state funds. The remaining ten percent of funds were Title IV-E monies funded through the federal government.

Juvenile Probation Departments

Structure. Juvenile probation departments implement the policies of juvenile boards, deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts, and provide services to at-risk youth in the community. There were 126 single-county departments and 43 multi-county departments in Texas in 2005. Multi-county departments range in size from two to six counties. While 12 departments served both adult and juvenile probationers in 2005 only 9 of these combined departments had designated juvenile probation officers.

Certification of Officers. TJPC requires that all Texas juvenile probation and detention officers be certified. Certification requires that officers have earned the necessary academic degree and complete 40 hours of approved continuing education annually.



During 2005, TJPC certified 272 new juvenile probation officers and 1,160 new detention officers. An additional 1,590 existing probation and detention officers were re-certified.

Salaries and Staffing. Based on data received from local departments in the Annual Resource Survey, juvenile probation departments across the state employed 7,676 salaried personnel at the end of 2005. This is an increase of 126 employees over 2004 staffing levels. Five departments in 2005 had only one employee (a chief juvenile probation officer). The following table shows the breakdown of department staff, average salaries and salary ranges.

Caseloads. Data reported in the Annual Resource Survey indicate that the average daily caseload per caseload-carrying juvenile probation officer in Texas ranged from one to 106 juveniles, with a statewide average of 24 in 2005. Some departments, primarily the large and urban departments, employ officers that carry specialized caseloads for one specific type of case only. For these specialized officers, the average daily caseload for deferred prosecution cases was 34, adjudicated probation was 29, and intensive supervision probation was 14.


Juvenile Justice and Education. Juvenile Justice Alternative Education programs – also known as JJAEPs – provide education services to youth that have been expelled from the public school system for committing specific offenses. JJAEPs are mandated in counties with populations of more than 125,000.

In school year 2004/2005, there were 26 mandatory JJAEPs operating in Texas. In addition, eight JJAEPs operated with state grant funds in counties with populations of less than 125,000. During the 2004/2005 school year the 26 mandatory JJAEPs had 7,242 student entries into their programs. Approximately 59% of the students in JJAEP programs were expelled from school for discretionary reasons, most commonly for serious and persistent misconduct.



Juvenile Population

The Texas juvenile justice system serves youth between the ages of 10 and 16. Youth 17 and over fall under the jurisdiction of the juvenile justice system only if their alleged offense was committed when the youth was 16 years old or younger. Using the Texas State Data Center projections based on the United States census 2000 population, there were 2,483,398 juveniles age 10 to 16 in Texas in 2005. Gender, race and age breakdowns of the projected 2005 figures are shown in the tables below.




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Juvenile Referral Activity CY 2005

Juvenile Crime Clock Calendar Year 1995 v. 2005




Referrals Calendar Year 1995 thru 2005

There were 102,373 formal referrals to juvenile probation departments in calendar year 2005. This compares to 107,794 formal referrals in 2004. The chart on the following page illustrates the number of referrals and the number of individual juveniles referred each year since 1995.


Police agencies accounted for nearly eight out of every ten formal referrals to juvenile probation departments in 2005. Schools, parents, social agencies, other probation departments and the Texas Youth Commission made the remaining referrals during the year.

A youth may be referred to a juvenile probation department for more than one offense in a single referral. When this happens, the most serious offense counts as the primary referral offense. Referrals in 2005 consisted of 119,878 separate offenses, for an average of 1.17 offenses per referral.







The chart below shows the distribution of referrals by county. The majority of counties had less than 100 referrals during the year.




Offense Distribution

As illustrated in the chart below, less than a quarter (22%) of the referrals in 2005 was for alleged felony offenses. The number of violent felony offense referrals decreased from 7,024 in 2004 to 6,733 in 2005. Within this category, aggravated assault and sexual assault referrals decreased 4% and 7% respectively from 2004 levels. The number of homicide referrals increased by 27% from 63 to 80.

The category of misdemeanor A & B offenses (which also includes contempt of magistrate orders) has remained relatively consistent as a percent of total referrals over the past four years. Nearly half (48%) of all referrals in 2005 were for these alleged, non-felony delinquent offenses.

The number of CINS offense referrals decreased 13%, from 19,459 in 2004 to 16,870 in 2005. As a percent of the total number of referrals, CINS offense referrals have decreased over the past four years.




Profile of Offenders

Male offenders accounted for 72% of all referrals in 2005. The proportion of female offenders has gradually increased over time, from 24% in 1992 to 28% in 2005. The offenses committed by females tend to be less severe than offenses committed by males. So while males account for the majority of offenses in all offense categories, females made up a higher proportion of the less severe offenses. In 2005, females committed 25% of all delinquent offenses and 44% of all CINS offenses.

While Anglo youth made up 41% of the state's juvenile population, they accounted for only 30% of referrals to juvenile probation departments. Hispanic juveniles were the most populous group in the state (42%) and accounted for 45% of referrals to probation in 2005. African American youth constituted 13% of the population and 25% of referrals.


The average age of juveniles referred in 2005 was 14½ years of age. However, 16 year-old youth were referred to juvenile probation more frequently than any other age group.

More than eight out of ten juveniles referred were attending regular school or were home schooled at the time of referral. The remaining juveniles were in alternative education centers, had been suspended or expelled, or had dropped out of school entirely.



Referral Rates


The average referral rate in was 41.2 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population. The average felony referral rate in 2005 was 8.9 referrals per 1,000 juveniles in the population. The chart below shows felony referral rates by county for the state. The majority of counties had low felony referral rates, experiencing less than 10 felony referrals per 1,000 juveniles.



Referral History

More than half of the juveniles referred in 2005 (53%) had been referred to juvenile probation previously (as illustrated in the diagram below). Of those juveniles with a prior referral, 36% had one prior referral, 21% had two prior referrals and 43% had 3 or more prior referrals.


Of juveniles with a prior referral, 43% had a felony as the most severe offense in their referral history, 47% had a misdemeanor A or B offense as the most serious prior offense (includes probation violations), and 10% had a CINS offense as the most serious prior offense.




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Juvenile Disposition and Supervision Activity CY 2005

Dispositions were made in 104,162 juvenile cases in calendar year 2005. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 40,783 (39%) of these cases, with 6,970 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 20,049 cases given supervisory caution, and 13,764 cases placed on deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 15,844 (15%) cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,151 cases with supervisory caution and 4,763 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 3,154 referrals, while 6,776 were refused and non-suited.

The remaining 47,535 (46%) cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution for 908 cases, deferred prosecution for 4,767 cases, adjudicated new or modified probation in 26,859 cases, certified and transferred to adult court 178 juveniles and committed to 2,665 juveniles to TYC (2,495 with indeterminate sentences and 170 with determinate sentences). 12,043 cases were consolidated, transferred, or dismissed and an additional 115 were found not guilty.



Distribution of Dispositions by Offense Severity and Race

In general, dispositions varied by the severity of the offense. As shown in the table titled *Dispositions by Offense Severity in 2005* offenses, more serious offenses tended to be disposed to more formal sanctions. Felony and violation of probation had a much higher proportion of adjudications to probation and commitments to the TYC than did misdemeanor A and B offenses. CINS offenses on the other hand had the highest proportion of supervisory caution dispositions.

The table, *Dispositions by Race in 2005*, illustrates that a higher proportion of Anglo juveniles received supervisory caution and deferred prosecution dispositions than did Hispanic and African American juveniles. A higher proportion of African American juveniles were disposed to probation and TYC than were Hispanic or Anglo juveniles.



Although African American juveniles were disposed to probation and TYC more frequently than Hispanic or Anglo youth, they had lowest proportion of felony offenses. The *Disposition Offense Severity by Race in 2005* table shows a higher percentage of Anglo youth were disposed for felony offenses than African American and Hispanic youth. Anglo youth were also disposed for a higher percentage of the misdemeanor A & B offenses. African American youth had the highest percentage of dispositions for a probation violation.



Beyond Juvenile Probation

The number of juveniles certified to stand trial as an adult increased 8.5%, from 164 in 2004 to 178 in 2005. During the same period, a decrease of 4% occurred in the number of commitments to TYC. In 2005, 2,655 juveniles were disposed to TYC commitment, compared to 2,774 juveniles disposed to TYC in 2004.

The chart below illustrates the number of juveniles committed to the TYC and the number of certifications to the adult system since 1995.




Supervision Workload Activity

On average, there were 23,365 juveniles on adjudicated probation per day during calendar year 2005. Of the 27,610 probation supervisions terminated during the year 6,429, or 23% were terminated prior to completing probation. Juveniles may have failed to complete probation for a number of reasons including commitment to TYC, transfer to an adult court for trial, absconding, or terminating early due to persistent non-compliance of supervision requirements, or transferring out of the department's jurisdiction.


The average daily population of juveniles on deferred prosecution during 2005 was 10,578. Of the 23,973 deferred prosecution supervisions terminated during the year, 4,740 (20%) terminated prior to completion. These juveniles may have failed to complete their deferred supervision because of the reasons listed above or they may have been disposed to court-order probation because of a violation of the deferred supervision agreement.

The average daily population of juveniles under pre-disposition supervision during 2005 was 7,730. Of the 45,244 supervisions leaving pre-disposition, 2,325 (5%) were completed unsuccessfully. Failure to complete a pre-disposition supervision usually results in adjudication or commitment to TYC.

Juveniles under supervision on January 1, 2005 accounted for a total of 41,923 supervisions active on that day. Of those under supervision on January 1, 2005, 25,387 or 61% were under probation supervision, 9,417 (22%) were on deferred prosecution and 7,119 (17%) were being supervised prior to disposition.



The chart below shows the number of juveniles under supervision by county on January 1, 2005. Supervision includes probations, deferred prosecutions, and pre-disposition supervisions.




Juvenile Detention and Residential Placement Activity in 2005

Detention Activity

There were 50,131 placements made in the 56 pre-adjudication secure residential and six short-term detention (i.e., holdover) facilities during 2005. On average, 1,748 youth were securely detained each day of the year.

Youth were detained for an average of 12.08 days. 21.3% of all juveniles securely detained were released in less than one day while 38.9% were detained for more than ten days.

The chart below provides information on the total number of detentions by county. The majority of counties detained fewer than 100 juveniles during the year.



Residential Placement Activity

A total of 10,416 out-of-home residential placements were made during calendar year 2005. The placements were made in both secure and non-secure residential facilities but did not include secure pre-adjudication or holdover facility placements. The average daily population of juveniles in residential placement was 2,953, with the cost of placement approximately \$90.00.

Registry of Secure Facilities

TJPC maintains a statewide registry for all public and private secure juvenile detention and juvenile secure post-adjudication placement facilities in Texas. The statewide registry functions as a database of information about each of these facilities operating in the state. Under the Texas Family Code, no child may be placed into a secure detention or secure post-adjudication placement facility that is not registered with TJPC. The table below shows the number, types and rated capacity of facilities registered in the 2005 Secure Facilities Registry.

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Glossary of Juvenile Justice Terminology

Active Cases - cases detained, placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

Adjudicated Probation - after going to court for an adjudication hearing on the facts, a judge may order this form of community-based supervision for a specified period of time, based on such reasonable and lawful terms as the court may determine. While on adjudicated probation, the offender may be required to participate in any program deemed appropriate, such as an intensive supervision program or residential placement.

Average Daily Population - average number of active juveniles detained placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

Average Length of Stay - average number of days completed cases spent in detention, on placement or under supervision during a specified period of time.

Certification as Adult - situation where the juvenile court waives its jurisdiction so that an accused juvenile felony offender can be prosecuted as an adult. Certification is permissive and not mandatory under Texas law. Depending upon the type of felony committed, a juvenile as young as 14 years of age can be certified to stand trial as an adult.

Child/Juvenile – for juvenile court jurisdiction, a person who is 10 years of age or older and under 17 years of age and commits an offense or a person who is 17 years of age or older and alleged to have engaged in delinquent conduct or CINS as a result of acts committed before becoming 17 years of age.

Commitment - a juvenile committed to the care, control and custody of the Texas Youth Commission (TYC). All commitments to the TYC, except under the determinate sentencing act, are for an indeterminate term not to extend beyond the juvenile's 21st birthday.

Conditional Release From Detention - juvenile released from detention or from the department's custody under written orders of conditional release. Most conditional releases are done at the time of the detention hearing or under authorization from the judge. The conditions should be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary to ensure the juvenile will return to court.

Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS) – non-criminal offenses which include public intoxication, truancy, running away from home, fineable only offenses that have been transferred to a juvenile court from a municipal or justice court, inhalant abuse, and expulsion for violating a school disciplinary code.

Deferred Prosecution - a voluntary supervision where the child, parent/guardian(s), prosecutor and the juvenile probation department agree upon conditions of supervision. Deferred prosecution can last up to six months and can be extended an additional six months by the court. If the child violates any of the deferred conditions, the department may elect to proceed with formal court adjudication and place the child on probation.

Delinquent Conduct - violation of any law punishable by incarceration or jail (except traffic laws), contempt of magistrate orders, and third offense driving under the influence of alcohol by a minor.

Department - a juvenile probation department organized and delivering services in one or more counties and supervised by a juvenile board.

Detention - any secure public or private pre-adjudication residential facility that is used for the temporary placement of a juvenile accused of having committed an offense.

Determinate Commitment - sentence imposed on a juvenile offender for up to 40 years. The juvenile will first serve time in TYC but may later be transferred to adult prison and become subject to adult parole laws. A determinate sentence is only available for certain types of felony offenses.



Intensive Supervision Program (ISP) – a program that is a means of diverting juvenile offenders from commitment to the Texas Youth Commission. Services provided vary from department to department but common elements include small caseloads supervised by specially trained probation officers and more frequent contacts between the juvenile and his or her probation officer.

Juvenile Board - a body established by law to oversee the provision of juvenile probation services to a county or counties.

Juvenile Court - a court designated under Section 51.04 of the Texas Family Code, or by other law, to exercise jurisdiction over proceedings under Title 3 of the Texas Family Code.

Program - a non-residential, department-operated or contracted/purchased service that is conducted for one or more days. A program must have a measurable or reportable objective and outcome. A program serves children who are on some type of supervision. (Does not include detention and out-of-home placement.)

Referral (also called Formal Referral) - any occasion when all three of the following conditions exist: (1) delinquent conduct, conduct indicating a need for supervision, or violation of probation was allegedly committed; (2) the juvenile probation department has jurisdiction and venue; and (3) face-to-face contact occurs with the office or official designated by the juvenile board.

Residential Placement - placement of a child in a secure or non-secure residential facility after disposition.

Status Offenses - juvenile offenses, such as runaway or truancy, that are not criminal when committed by adults.

Supervisory Caution - descriptive term for a wide variety of summary, non-judicial dispositions that may be made in a case. This may include referral of the child to a social agency or a community based first offender program run by law enforcement, contacting parents to inform them of the child's activities, or simply warning the child about his or her activities.
