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## **Acknowledgement**

The Texas Juvenile Justice Department expresses its appreciation to the many juvenile probation officers, juvenile court judges and others whose prompt and continued submission of their statistical and other data have made this report possible.

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## Overview

The Texas Juvenile Justice Department's annual activity report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile criminal activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to assist the state's effort to improve the juvenile justice system and reduce juvenile crime in Texas. In the past the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission (TJPC) has released this report. In December 2011, the TJPC was merged with the Texas Youth Commission and formed the Texas Juvenile Justice Department.

During calendar year 2012, police agencies in Texas processed 91,873 arrests of juveniles between the ages of 10 and 16. Of this number, 40,473 were warned and released, handled in justice and municipal courts, or diverted and 51,400 were referred to juvenile probation departments. Schools, probation departments, municipal courts and the state referred another 19,760 cases for delinquent conduct or conduct in need of supervision. There were a total of 71,160 referrals to juvenile probation departments in calendar year 2012.

This is a decrease of 3,556 (5 percent) referrals from calendar year 2011. Delinquent offenses also decreased 5 percent from 2011. Violation of probation referrals increased 2 percent while misdemeanor and contempt offense referrals decreased 5 percent.

The 254 counties in Texas were served through 166 juvenile probation departments in 2012. These departments were staffed by a total of 7,971 employees, 1,725 of whom carried a supervision caseload.

Counties registered and operated 48 secure pre-adjudication residential facilities, two holdover facilities, 32 secure post-adjudication residential facilities and 11 non-secure correctional facilities in 2012. In addition to the county-operated facilities, private contractors provided services for juveniles in two pre-adjudication facilities, two post-adjudication secure facilities, and two holdover facilities. These facilities provided a combined total of 3,054 pre-adjudication, 30 holdover and 2,085 post-adjudication beds.

In 2012, 38,607 juveniles were held in secure detention facilities prior to adjudication hearings. Approximately 23 percent of those detained were released in less than one day. There were 9,619 placements made to residential facilities, generally following the juvenile's disposition.

Dispositions were made in 74,500 juvenile cases in calendar year 2012. Disposition of a case may result from action taken by the juvenile department, the juvenile prosecutor or the juvenile court. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 28,720 of these cases, with 3,767 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 14,029 cases given supervisory caution and 10,924 cases given deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 12,858 cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,082 cases with supervisory caution and 3,871 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 1,939 referrals, while 5,966 were refused or non-suited.


The remaining 32,922 cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution for 224 cases, deferred prosecution for 4,111 cases, new or modified probation in 18,612 cases, certified and transferred to adult court 174 juveniles and committed 823 juveniles to the TJJD (728 with indeterminate sentences and 95 with determinate sentences). There were 8,809 cases consolidated, transferred, adjudicated with no disposition or dismissed, while 169 were found not guilty.

Overall, dispositions most often resulted in probation and deferred prosecution for the juvenile. In 2012, 25 percent of cases were disposed to probation and an additional 25 percent were disposed to deferred prosecution. Twenty-one percent of cases were disposed with a supervisory caution, and 20 percent were dismissed, found not guilty, or transferred. Less than 2 percent of dispositions resulted in commitment to the TJJD or certification as an adult. An additional 8 percent of dispositions were consolidated or transferred.





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# The Texas Juvenile Probation System

## Introduction

The Texas Juvenile Justice Department collects statistical data relating to juveniles referred to the juvenile justice system from all counties in the state. Beginning January 1999, juvenile probation departments have been required to submit individual case file data in an electronic format to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department. In addition, annual reporting and periodic surveys from departments provide supplemental information to the agency.



Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from the statistics. The data portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics.

At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics and should be considered when evaluating them:

1. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Emphasis is placed on the rehabilitation of the juvenile through accountability, guidance, counseling, diversion and treatment. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as *supervisory caution* or *dismissed or otherwise disposed*, have received rehabilitative and other services from the juvenile probation system. These services are not captured in the activities presented in this report.
2. A number of juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies.
3. Juvenile probation officers in multi-county departments may spend more time traveling than do officers in single-county jurisdictions.

## Juvenile Boards

State law requires each department to have a juvenile board. Some of these boards govern multiple counties. Each board, consisting of district and county judges, is responsible for overseeing the operation of the juvenile probation system in that county. This includes designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer and setting the policy and budget for the juvenile probation department. The TJJD provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.



**Funding.** The TJJD is the primary agency through which state funding for juvenile probation is channeled to the counties. State funds accounted for approximately 28 percent of total funding for juvenile probation services in fiscal year 2012. Local commissioner's courts provided approximately 71 percent of the total from county revenues. Juvenile boards work closely with the commissioner's court to set budgets for operation of local juvenile probation departments using both local and state funds. The remaining 2 percent of funds was Title IV-E monies funded through the federal government.

## Juvenile Probation Departments

**Structure.** Juvenile probation departments implement the policies of juvenile boards, deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts, and provide services to at-risk youth in the community. There were 122 single-county departments and 44 multi-county departments in Texas in 2012. Multi-county departments range in size from two to six counties. Eight departments served both adult and juvenile probationers in 2012. Only six of these combined departments had designated juvenile probation officers.



**Certification of Officers.** The TJJJ requires that all Texas juvenile probation and detention officers be certified. Certification requires that officers earn the necessary academic degree and complete 80 hours of approved continuing education. All officers must also undergo a criminal background check at certification and certification renewal. During 2012, the TJJJ certified 230 new juvenile probation officer applications and 1,160 new detention officer applications. An additional 2,438 existing probation and detention officer applications were re-certified. Overall, 3,828 juvenile probations and detention officers received certification.

**Salaries and Staffing.** Based on data received from local departments in the Annual Resource Survey, juvenile probation departments across the state employed 7,971 salaried personnel at the end of 2012. Five departments had only one employee (a chief juvenile probation officer). The following table shows the breakdown of department staff, average salaries and salary ranges.

**Caseloads.** Data reported in the Annual Resource Survey indicate that the average daily caseload per caseload-carrying juvenile probation officer in Texas ranged from one to 77 juveniles, with a statewide average of 18 in 2012. Some departments, primarily the large and urban departments, employ officers that carry specialized caseloads for one specific type of case only. For these specialized officers, the average daily caseload for deferred prosecution cases was 17, adjudicated probation was 16 and intensive supervision probation was 11.




**Juvenile Justice and Education.** Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Programs – also known as JJAEPs – provide education services to youth that have been expelled from the public school system for committing specific offenses. JJAEPs are mandated in counties with populations of more than 125,000.

In school year 2011-2012, there were 27 mandatory JJAEPs operating in Texas. In addition, six JJAEPs operated with state grant funds in counties with populations of less than 125,000. During the 2011-2012 school years the 27 mandatory JJAEPs had 3,894 student entries into their programs. Approximately 44 percent of the students in JJAEP programs were expelled from school for discretionary reasons.

**Juvenile Population**

The Texas juvenile justice system serves youth between the ages of 10 and 16. Youth 17 and over fall under the jurisdiction of the juvenile justice system only if their alleged offense was committed when the youth was 16 years old or younger. Using the Texas State Data Center .5 migration scenario projections based on the United States Census 2010 population, there were 2,697,104 juveniles age 10 to 16 in Texas in 2012. Gender, race and age breakdowns of the projected 2011 populations are shown in the tables below.

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


## Juvenile Referral Activity


There were 71,160 formal referrals to juvenile probation departments in calendar year 2012. This compares to 74,716 formal referrals in 2011. The charts below illustrate the number of referrals and the number of individual juveniles referred each year since 2005.

Police agencies accounted for nearly 72 percent of formal referrals to juvenile probation departments in 2012. Schools, juvenile probation departments, the Texas Juvenile Justice Department and other agencies made the remaining referrals during the year.

A youth may be referred to a juvenile probation department for more than one offense in a single referral. When this happens, the most serious offense counts as the primary referral offense. Referrals in 2012 consisted of 140,048 separate offenses, for an average of 2 offenses per referral.



The map below shows the distribution of referrals by county. The majority of counties had less than 100 formal referrals during the year.




## Offense Distribution

As illustrated in the chart below, less than a quarter (21 percent) of the referrals in 2012 was for alleged felony offenses. The number of violent felony offense referrals decreased, from 5,562 in 2011 to 5,387 in 2012. Within this category, assaultive referrals decreased, from 3,227 in 2011 to 2,956 in 2012. The number of sexual assault referrals increased, from 1,376 in 2011 to 1,527 in 2012.

The category of misdemeanor A & B offenses (which also includes contempt of magistrate orders) has increased slightly as a percent of total referrals over the past four years. A little over half (52 percent) of all referrals in 2012 were for these alleged, non-felony delinquent offenses.

The number of Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS) offense referrals decreased, from 8,882 in 2011 to 8,090 in 2012. As a percent of the total number of referrals, CINS offense referrals accounted for 12 percent of total referrals in 2011 and 11 percent of total referrals in 2012.



## Profile of Offenders

Male offenders accounted for 73 percent of all referrals in both 2011 and 2012. The proportion of female referrals remained at 27 percent in both 2011 and 2012.

While Anglo youth made up 34 percent of the state's juvenile population in 2012, they accounted for only 25 percent of referrals to juvenile probation departments. Hispanic juveniles were the most populous group in the state (48 percent) and accounted for 49 percent of referrals to probation in 2012. African American youth accounted for 12 percent of the population and 25 percent of referrals. Juveniles of "Other" Race/Ethnicity, which includes Asian and American Indian, accounted for 1 percent of referrals.

The average age of juveniles referred in 2012 was 15. However, 16 year-old youth were referred to juvenile probation more frequently than any other age group. Juveniles age 17 and older may be referred for an offense committed while 16 or younger or, if they are under supervision, for a violation of a juvenile court order.


More than eight out of 10 juveniles referred were attending regular school or were home schooled at the time of referral. The remaining juveniles were in alternative education programs, had been suspended or expelled, or had dropped out of school.



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## Referral Rates

The average referral rate in 2012 was 26 referrals per 1,000 juveniles age 10 to 16 in the population. The map below shows felony referral rates by county for the state. The majority of counties had low felony referral rates, experiencing less than nine felony referrals per 1,000 juveniles age 10 to 16.




## Referral History

More than half of the juveniles referred in 2012 (51 percent) had been referred to juvenile probation previously. Of those juveniles with a prior referral, 35 percent had one prior referral, 20 percent had two prior referrals and 45 percent had three or more prior referrals.

Of the 51 percent of juveniles with a prior referral, 46 percent had a felony as the most severe prior offense in their referral history, 46 percent had a misdemeanor A or B offense as the most serious prior offense (includes probation violations), and 8 percent had a CINS offense as the most serious prior offense.

### Juvenile Referral History Calendar Year 2012




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
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## Juvenile Disposition and Supervision Activity

Dispositions were made in 74,500 juvenile cases in calendar year 2012. Juvenile probation departments disposed 28,720 or 39 percent of these cases, with 3,767 cases dismissed or withdrawn, 14,029 cases disposed with a supervisory caution, and 10,924 cases disposed to deferred prosecution.

Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 12,858 (17 percent) cases. Prosecutors disposed of 1,082 cases with supervisory caution and 3,871 with deferred prosecution. No probable cause was found in 1,939 referrals, while 5,966 were refused or non-suited.

The remaining 32,922 (44 percent) cases were resolved by the juvenile court. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution for 224 cases, deferred prosecution for 4,111 cases, new or modified probation in 18,612 cases, certified and transferred to adult court 174 juveniles and committed 823 juveniles to the TJJD (728 with indeterminate sentences and 95 with determinate sentences). There were 8,809 cases consolidated, transferred, adjudicated with no disposition or dismissed, while 169 were found not guilty.



## Distribution of Dispositions by Offense Severity and Race

In general, dispositions varied by the severity of the offense. As shown in the table titled *Dispositions by Offense Severity Calendar Year 2012*, more serious offenses tended to be disposed to more formal sanctions. Felony and violation of probation offenses had a much higher proportion of adjudications to probation than did misdemeanor A and B offenses. CINS offenses on the other hand had the highest proportion of supervisory caution dispositions.

The table, *Dispositions by Race Calendar Year 2012*, illustrates that a higher proportion of Anglo juveniles received supervisory caution and deferred prosecution dispositions than did Hispanic or African American juveniles. A higher proportion of African American juveniles were disposed to probation and TJJD than were Hispanic or Anglo juveniles.



Although African American juveniles were disposed to probation and the TJJD more frequently than Hispanic or Anglo youth, Anglos had the highest proportion of felony offenses. The *Disposition Offense Severity by Race CY 2011* table shows a higher percentage of Anglo youth were disposed for a felony offense than African American and Hispanic youth. Anglo youth were also disposed for a higher percentage of misdemeanor A & B offenses. African American youth had the highest percentage of dispositions for a probation violation.



### Beyond Juvenile Probation

The number of juveniles certified to stand trial as an adult stayed approximately the same from 175 in 2011 to 174 in 2012. During the same period, the number of commitments to the TJJD decreased 14 percent. Since 2006 there has been a 72 percent decrease in the number of juveniles committed to the TJJD per year.

The chart below illustrates the number of juveniles committed to the TJJD and the number of certifications to the adult system since 2002.



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
## Supervision Workload Activity

On average, there were 24,512 juveniles on adjudicated probation per day during calendar year 2012. Of the 18,967 probation supervisions terminated during the year, 81 percent were terminated upon completion of supervision while 19percent were unsuccessfully terminated prior to completing probation. Juveniles may have failed to complete probation for a number of reasons including commitment to the TJJD, transfer to an adult court for trial, absconding, terminating early due to persistent non-compliance of supervision requirements or transferring out of the department's jurisdiction.


The average daily population of juveniles on deferred prosecution during 2012 was 8,082. Of the 19,660 deferred prosecution supervisions terminated during the year, 82percent were terminated upon completion of supervision while 18percent were unsuccessfully terminated prior to completion. Juveniles may have failed to complete their deferred supervision because of the reasons listed above or they may have been disposed to court-order probation because of a violation of the deferred supervision agreement.

The average daily population of juveniles under pre-disposition supervision during 2012 was 5,489. Of the 23,224 pre-disposition supervisions terminated during the year, 97percent were terminated upon completion of supervision while 3percent were terminated unsuccessfully.

Cases under supervision on January 1, 2012, accounted for a total of 28,381 supervisions active on that day. Of those under supervision on January 1, 2012, 56 percent were under probation supervision, 25 percent were on deferred prosecution and 19 percent were being supervised prior to disposition.



The map below shows the number of juveniles under supervision by county on January 1, 2012. Supervision includes probation, deferred prosecution and pre-disposition supervision. The vast majority of counties had fewer than 50 juveniles under supervision.



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
## Juvenile Detention and Residential Placement Activity

### Detention Activity

There were 38,607 placements made in the 50 pre-adjudication secure residential and four short-term detention (i.e. holdover) facilities during 2012. On average, 1,419 youth were securely detained each day of the year.

Youth were detained for an average of 13 days per detention. Twenty-three percent of all juveniles securely detained were released in less than one day, while 42 percent were detained for more than ten days.

The map below provides information on the total number of detentions by county. The majority of counties detained fewer than 100 juveniles during the year.



### Residential Placement Activity

A total of 9,619 out-of-home residential placements were made during calendar year 2012. The placements were made in both secure and non-secure residential facilities, but did not include secure pre-adjudication or holdover facility placements. The average daily population of juveniles in residential placement was 2,335.



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## Registry of Secure Facilities

The TJJD maintains a statewide registry for all public and private secure juvenile detention and juvenile secure post-adjudication placement facilities in Texas. The statewide registry functions as a database of self-reported information about each of these facilities operating in the state. Under the Texas Family Code, no child may be placed into a secure detention or secure post-adjudication placement facility that is not registered with TJJD. The table below shows the number and types of facilities registered at any time during the year. The rated capacity reflects the capacity of those facilities operating at the end of the calendar year.

In 2012 the TJJD began registering non-secure facilities operated by juvenile probation departments. While the vast majority of non-secure facilities are licensed through the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (TDFPS), these juvenile probation operated facilities do provide services to youth. In 2012, 11 non-secure facilities were registered by the TJJD. These facilities had a rated capacity of 456 beds.

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## Glossary of Juvenile Probation Terminology

**Active Cases** - cases detained, placed or supervised during a specified period of time.

**Adjudicated Probation** - after going to court for an adjudication hearing on the facts, a judge may order this form of community-based supervision for a specified period of time, based on such reasonable and lawful terms as the court may determine. While on adjudicated probation, the juvenile may be required to participate in any program deemed appropriate, such as an intensive supervision program or residential placement.

**Average Daily Population** - average number of active juveniles detained, placed or supervised per day during a specified period of time.

**Average Length of Stay** - average number of days completed cases spent in detention, on placement or under supervision during a specified period of time.

**Certification as Adult** - situation where the juvenile court waives its jurisdiction so that an accused juvenile felony offender can be prosecuted as an adult. Certification is permissive and not mandatory under Texas law. Depending upon the type of felony committed, a juvenile as young as 14 years of age can be certified to stand trial as an adult.

**Child/Juvenile** – for juvenile court jurisdiction, a person who is 10 years of age or older and under 17 years of age and commits an offense or a person who is 17 years of age or older and alleged to have engaged in delinquent conduct or CINS as a result of acts committed before becoming 17 years of age.

**Commitment** - a juvenile committed to the care, control and custody of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD). In 2012, all commitments to the TJJD, except those under the determinate sentencing act, were for an indeterminate term not to extend beyond the juvenile's 19th birthday.

**Conditional Release From Detention** - juvenile released from detention or from the department's custody under written orders of conditional release. Most conditional releases are done at the time of the detention hearing or under authorization from the judge. The conditions should be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary to ensure the juvenile will return to court.

**Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS)** – non-criminal offenses which include public intoxication, truancy, running away from home, fineable only offenses that have been transferred to a juvenile court from a municipal or justice court, inhalant abuse, and expulsion for violating a school disciplinary code.

**Deferred Prosecution** - a voluntary supervision where the child, parent/guardian(s), prosecutor and the juvenile probation department agree upon conditions of supervision. Deferred prosecution can last up to six months and can be extended an additional six months by the court. If the child violates any of the deferred conditions, the department may elect to proceed with formal court adjudication and place the child on probation.

**Delinquent Conduct** - violation of any law punishable by incarceration or jail (except traffic laws), contempt of magistrate orders, and third offense driving under the influence of alcohol by a minor.

**Department** - a juvenile probation department organized and delivering services in one or more counties and supervised by a juvenile board.



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**Detention** - any secure public or private pre-adjudication residential facility that is used for the temporary placement of a juvenile accused of having committed an offense.

**Determinate Commitment** - sentence imposed on a juvenile offender for up to 40 years. The juvenile will first serve time in the TJJD but may later be transferred to adult prison or adult parole. A determinate sentence is only available for certain types of felony offenses.

**Juvenile Board** - a body established by law to oversee the provision of juvenile probation services to a county or counties.

**Juvenile Court** - a court designated under Section 51.04 of the Texas Family Code, or by other law, to exercise jurisdiction over proceedings under Title 3 of the Texas Family Code.

**Program** - A program is a planned or coordinated activity or group of activities designed to address a specific purpose or goal. These goals include, but are not limited to, altering a juvenile's behavior to reduce delinquency.

**Referral (also called Formal Referral)** - any occasion when all three of the following conditions exist: (1) delinquent conduct, conduct indicating a need for supervision, or violation of probation was allegedly committed; (2) the juvenile probation department has jurisdiction and venue; and (3) face-to-face contact occurs with the office or official designated by the juvenile board.

**Residential Placement** - placement of a child in a secure or non-secure residential facility after disposition.

**Status Offenses** - juvenile offenses, such as runaway or truancy, that are not criminal when committed by adults.

**Supervisory Caution** - descriptive term for a wide variety of summary, non-judicial dispositions that may be made in a case. This may include referring the child to a social service agency or a community based first offender program operated by law enforcement, contacting parents to inform them of the child's activities, or simply warning the child about his or her activities.
