

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Overview

The Texas Juvenile Justice Department's annual activity report provides information regarding the magnitude and nature of juvenile criminal activity and the juvenile probation system's response. This information is offered to assist the state's effort in improving the juvenile justice system and reducing juvenile crime in Texas.

During calendar year 2013, police agencies in Texas processed 70,561 arrests of juveniles between the ages of 10 and 16. Not all arrests resulted in referrals to juvenile probation. In 2013, juvenile departments saw 67,028 referrals. Law enforcement accounted for 72.2% of all referrals (48,380). Schools, probation departments, municipal courts and TJJD referred another 18,648 cases for delinquent conduct or conduct in need of supervision, totaling 67,028 referrals¹ for calendar year 2013. This is a decrease of 4,132 (5.8%) referrals from calendar year 2012, with specific delinquent offenses decreasing 5.6%, violation of probation decreasing 4.6%, and CINS offenses 8.7%.

Most juveniles referred were attending regular school (80.5%) at the time of their referral to a juvenile probation department. The remaining juveniles were in a different learning environment (home school, charter school, private school, or alternative education program), had received their GED, had graduated, had dropped out of school, or had been suspended or expelled. Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Programs (JJAEP) provide education services to juveniles that have been expelled from the public school system for committing specific offenses. JJAEPs are mandated in counties with populations of more than 125,000. In school year 2012-2013, there were 26 mandatory JJAEPs operating in Texas. An additional six JJAEPs operated with state grant funds in counties with populations less than 125,000. During the 2012-2013 school years, the 26 mandatory JJAEPs had 3,079 student entries into their programs. Approximately 41% of the students in JJAEP programs were expelled from school for discretionary reasons.²

Disposition of a case may result from action taken by the juvenile department, the juvenile prosecutor, or the juvenile court. There were a total of 69,708 dispositions given in 2013. Juvenile probation departments disposed of 27,343 (39.2%) of these cases. Of cases disposed by departments, 13.7% of were dismissed or withdrawn, 49.1% were given supervisory caution, and 37.2% were given deferred prosecution. Juvenile prosecutors resolved an additional 12,624 cases, with 62.5% of cases being found to have no probable cause, dismissed, or refused; 7.8% given supervisory caution; and 29.7% given deferred prosecution.

The juvenile court resolved the remaining 29,741 cases. Of these, the court ordered supervisory caution for less than 1.0% of cases (n = 201), deferred prosecution for 12.5% of cases, and ordered a new or modified probation in 59.0% of cases. The court certified and transferred to adult court 199 juveniles and committed 864 juveniles to TJJD. Of juveniles committed to TJJD, 774 were given indeterminate sentences and 90 were given determinate sentences³. A disposition of not guilty was found in 181 cases. There were an additional 5,111 cases the court consolidated, transferred, or adjudicated with no disposition.

Overall, dispositions most often resulted in deferred prosecution or probation supervision (25.3% and 25.2%, respectively). Cases dismissed or disposed with a supervisory caution made up the next two largest categories (20.9% and 21.0%, respectively). Only 1.3% of dispositions resulted in a juvenile being committed to TJJD and only 0.3% resulted in adult certification.

In 2013, 166 juvenile probation departments served the 254 counties in Texas. These departments were staffed by 8,185 employees, 1,745 of which directly supervised juveniles. The average length of probation supervision was 398 days while the average length of deferred prosecution supervision and pre-disposition supervision was 154 days and 105 days, respectively. The majority of probation, deferred prosecution, and pre-disposition supervision terminations during calendar year 2013 ended with successful completion.

Counties registered and operated 47 secure pre-adjudication residential facilities, three holdover facilities, 32 secure post-adjudication residential facilities, and 13 non-secure correctional facilities in 2013. In addition to the county-operated facilities, private contractors provided services for juveniles in three pre-adjudication facilities and three post-adjudication secure facilities. The secure facilities provided a combined 3,037 pre-adjudication, 30 holdover, and 2,237 post-adjudication beds.

There were 37,226 detentions in 2013. Approximately 28.0% of juveniles detained were released in less than one day. There were 9,407 placements made to secure or non-secure residential facilities in 2013, generally following the juvenile's disposition. More juveniles were served in non-secure facilities (n = 5,326) than secure facilities (n = 4,081) in calendar year 2013. The overall average length of stay for residential placements (secure and non-secure) was 125.16 days. The majority of residential placements that terminated during calendar year 2013 ended in successful completion.

The Texas Juvenile Probation System

Introduction⁴

Since January 1999, juvenile probation departments have been required to submit individual case file data in an electronic format initially to the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission (TJPC), and currently the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD). In addition, annual reporting and periodic surveys from departments provide supplemental information to the agency.


Caution should be used in drawing general conclusions from the statistics. The data in this report portray neither everything juvenile probation departments or courts do, nor how much time they spend on activities not represented by the statistics. At least three factors are not represented in the juvenile probation activity statistics and should be considered when evaluating them:

1. The juvenile justice system operates under the rules and authority of Title 3 of the Texas Family Code. Many of the cases statistically reported as being disposed as *supervisory caution*, *dismissed*, or *otherwise disposed* have received rehabilitative and other services from the juvenile probation system. These services are not captured in the activities presented in this report.
2. Only formal referrals are reported in referral, disposition, supervision, and detention statistics. Departments also handle a number of informal referrals such as crisis intervention and prevention/intervention which are not captured in this report.
3. A number of juvenile probation officers serve both adult and juvenile capacities and often operate under widely varying authorities and policies.

Funding. Juvenile boards work closely with the commissioner’s court to set budgets for operation of local juvenile probation departments using both local and state funds. Local commissioner’s courts provided approximately 72.0% of the total funding to probation departments from county revenues. State funds, primarily channeled through TJJD, accounted for approximately 27.0% of total funding for juvenile probation services in fiscal year 2013. The remaining 1.0% of funds was Title IV-E monies funded through the federal government.

Juvenile Population. The Texas juvenile justice system serves youth between the ages of 10 and 16. Youth ages 17 and older fall under the jurisdiction of the juvenile justice system only if their alleged offense was committed when the youth was 16 years old or younger or for a violation of a juvenile court order if the youth is still under supervision. Using the Texas State Data Center 0.5 migration scenario projections based on the United States Census 2010 population, there were 2,731,000 juveniles age 10 to 16 in Texas in 2013. Gender, race and age breakdowns of the projected 2013 populations are shown in Figure 1. Overall, 51.2% of the youth population was male and 48.8% of the youth population was female. This trend remained steady across race categories.

Juvenile Probation Departments

Juvenile Boards. State law requires each department to have a juvenile board. Some of these boards govern multiple counties. Each board, consisting of district and county judges, is responsible for overseeing the operation of the juvenile probation system in that county. This includes designating juvenile judges, appointing the chief juvenile probation officer, and setting the policies and budget for the juvenile probation department. TJJD provides funding and technical assistance to juvenile boards.

Structure. Juvenile probation departments implement the policies of juvenile boards, deliver services to juveniles referred to juvenile courts, and provide services to at-risk youth in the community. There were 128 single-county departments and 38 multi-county departments in Texas in 2013. Multi-county departments range in size from two to six counties. Eight departments served both adult and juvenile probationers in 2013. Only five of these combined adult & juvenile departments had designated juvenile probation officers.

Certification of Officers. Certification is required for all Texas juvenile probation and supervision officers. Certification requires that officers earn the necessary academic degree and complete 80 hours of approved continuing education. Probation officers must hold, at minimum, a bachelor's degree while supervision officers most hold, at minimum, a high school diploma or GED. All officers must also undergo a criminal background check at initial certification and certification renewal. In 2013, TJJD certified 244 new juvenile probation officers and 967 new supervision officers. An additional 2,776 existing probation and supervision officer applications were re-certified.

Salaries, Staffing, and Caseload. Based on data received from local departments in the 2013 Annual Resource Survey, juvenile probation departments across the state employed 8,188 salaried personnel at the end of 2013. Four departments had only one employee, a Chief Probation Officer. The following table shows the breakdown of department staff, average salaries and salary ranges. The average daily caseload per caseload-carrying juvenile probation officer in Texas ranged from two to 32 juveniles, with a statewide average of 16 in 2013.

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Juvenile Referral Activity

A youth may be referred multiple times in a year. In calendar year 2013, 47,530 juveniles contributed 67,028 formal referrals to juvenile probation departments. Importantly, despite an increase in the juvenile population of Texas, referrals to juvenile probation departments continue to decline as evidenced in Figure 2.

Figure 2: Juvenile Population vs. Referrals – Calendar Years 2008-2013




Figure 3 below highlights the referral rate by county per 1,000 youth. The state referral rate for 2013 was 25 youth per 1,000, with most counties having a referral rate between 11 and 25. Figure 4 highlights the felony referral rate per 1,000 youth by county, with most counties below five felony referrals per 1,000 youth.

Figure 3: Referral Rate per 1,000 – Calendar Year 2013





Figure 4: Felony Referral Rate per 1,000 – Calendar Year 2013



Offender Demographics

Male offenders accounted for 74.0% of all referrals to juvenile probation departments in 2013 and females contributed the remaining 26.0%. While Caucasian youth made up 33.7% of the state’s juvenile population in 2013, they accounted for only 23.6% of referrals to juvenile probation departments. Hispanic youth were the most populous group in the state (48.3%) and accounted for 49.0% of referrals to probation in 2013. African American youth accounted for 11.9% of the population and 26.4% of referrals. Juveniles of “Other” race category, including Asian and Native American, accounted for 6.1% of the state population and only 1.0% of referrals.

Figure 5: Gender of Referrals – Calendar Year 2013






Figure 6: Race of Referrals – Calendar Year 2013


Figure 7: Age at Referral – Calendar Year 2013

Of all referrals in 2013, the average age of juveniles was 15 years. However, 16-year-old youth were referred to juvenile probation more frequently than any other age group. Youth age 17 or older are included in Figure 7 as they may have been referred for an offense committed while 16 or younger or for a violation of a juvenile court order if they are under supervision with a juvenile probation department.

Offense Distribution

As illustrated in Figure 8, referrals to juvenile probation departments have steadily declined since 2008. Referrals for alleged delinquent offenses (including felony, misdemeanor A and B, and contempt of magistrate) make up the majority of all referrals in a given year. Less than a quarter (21.2%) of the referrals in 2013 was for alleged felony offenses. Only 8.0% of all alleged offenses qualified as violent felonies in 2013.

Since 2008, referrals for both alleged delinquent offenses and violation of probation offenses have increased slightly as a percent of total referrals. Conversely, referrals for alleged Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS) offenses (including status and non-status) have decreased as a percent of total referrals since 2008.



Referral History

Less than half of the juveniles referred in 2013 (41.9%) had been previously referred to juvenile probation departments. Most juveniles with a referral history had only had one prior referral since calendar year 2007 (39.7%). The next largest category for prior referrals was four or more (28.1%). Of the juveniles with a prior referral history, 39.3% had at least one referral for a prior felony offense, 16.2% a prior violent felony offense, and 38.5% a prior violation of probation.


Figure 9: Juvenile Referral History – Calendar Year 2013



Juvenile Disposition and Supervision Activity


There were 69,708 juvenile cases disposed in calendar year 2013. The juvenile court disposed of the majority of cases (42.7%), followed by probation departments (39.2%) and prosecutors (18.1%). Of the 69,708 cases disposed, 4,302 (6.2%) received an outcome of consolidated or transferred with no adjudication. Of the remaining 65,406 cases, over half received dispositions of deferred prosecution or probation supervision⁶ (27.0% and 26.8%, respectively). Cases disposed as supervisory caution made up 22.3% of dispositions and dismissed⁷ cases another 22.3%. The remaining cases were disposed as TJJD commitment (1.3%) or adult certification (0.3%).

The number of juveniles certified to stand trial as an adult increased 14.4% between 2012 and 2013. During the same period, commitments to TJJD increased by 5.0%. However, the number of TJJD commitments and adult certifications has decreased 49.7% and 26.3%, respectively, from 2008 numbers.

Distribution of Dispositions by Offense Severity and Race

In general, dispositions varied by the severity of the offense. As demonstrated in Table 3, offenses that are more serious tended to receive formal sanctions. Felony and violation of probation offenses had a much higher proportion of adjudications to probation than did misdemeanor offenses. CINS offenses were most likely to receive a Supervisory Caution disposition.





Figure 13: Disposition Offense Severity by Race – Calendar Year 2013

Figure 12 illustrates the proportion of dispositions by race. In calendar year 2013, African American youth were more likely to receive a disposition to probation than any other disposition. Caucasian youth and youth of Other races received more deferred prosecutions than any other disposition. Hispanic youth had slightly more probation dispositions than deferred prosecution. African American youth were more likely to receive a disposition of commitment to TJJD or Adult Certification. Figure 13 illustrates the proportion of disposition offense severity by race. African American and Caucasian youth had the highest proportion of dispositions for a felony offense. A higher proportion of African American youth received a disposition for a violation of probation offense.

Figure 12: Dispositions by Race – Calendar Year 2013

Supervision Workload Activity ⁸

The average daily population (ADP) for probation supervision in calendar year 2013 was 14,973. Successful completions accounted for 76.1% of the 17,548 probation supervisions terminated during the year while 23.9% were unsuccessfully terminated prior to completing probation. Juveniles may have failed to complete probation for a number of reasons including commitment to TJJD, transfer to an adult court for trial, absconding, terminating early due to persistent non-compliance of supervision requirements or transferring out of the department’s jurisdiction.

The ADP of juveniles on deferred prosecution during 2013 was 7,466. Successful completions of deferred prosecution comprised 81.1% of the 18,704 deferred prosecution supervisions terminated during the year while 18.9% were unsuccessfully terminated prior to completion. Juveniles may have failed to complete their deferred supervision because of the reasons listed above or they may have been disposed to court-order probation because of a violation of the deferred supervision agreement.

The ADP of juveniles under pre-disposition supervision (including Conditional Pre-Disposition Supervision and Temporary Pre-Court Monitoring) during 2013 was 4,990. Of the 22,305 pre-disposition supervisions terminated during the year, 90.8% were terminated upon completion of supervision while 9.2% were terminated unsuccessfully.

There were 28,157 active supervisions on January 1, 2013. Of those under supervision on this date, 57.2% were under probation supervision, 25.1% were on deferred prosecution, and 17.7% were on pre-disposition supervision. The map below displays the number of active supervisions on January 1, 2013 by county. Supervision includes probation, deferred prosecution and pre-disposition supervision. The vast majority (70.5%) of counties had 50 or fewer active supervisions on this date.

Figure 14: Cases under Supervision on January 1, 2013





Figure 15: Cases under Supervision on January 1, 2013

Juvenile Detention and Residential Placement Activity

Registry of Secure Facilities

TJJD maintains a statewide registry for all public and private secure juvenile detention and juvenile secure post-adjudication placement facilities in Texas. The statewide registry functions as a database of self-reported information about each of these facilities operating in the state. Under the Texas Family Code, no child may be placed into a secure detention or secure post-adjudication placement facility that is not registered with TJJD.

In 2011, TJJD began registering non-secure facilities operated by juvenile probation departments. The primary difference between a non-secure and secure facility is the lack of a secured perimeter or facility procedures within a non-secure facility, which do not restrict the doorways from youth within the facility. While the vast majority of the state’s non-secure residential facilities are licensed exclusively through the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (TDFPS), juvenile probation operated non-secure facilities registered with TJJD prioritize services to juvenile justice youth. In 2013, 13 non-secure facilities were registered by TJJD. These facilities had a rated capacity of 486 beds. Table 4 provides the number and types of facilities registered at any time during 2013. The rated capacity reflects the self-reported capacity of those facilities operating at the end of the calendar year.



Detention Activity

There were 37,226 placements made in the 47 pre-adjudication secure and three short-term detention (i.e. holdover) facilities during 2013. The average daily population (ADP) for detentions in calendar year 2013 was 1,431. Youth were detained for an average of 15.99 days per detention. Of youth detained, 28.0% were detained for less than 24 hours, 28.1% for two to 10 days, and 44.0% for more than 10 days. Figure 16 provides the total number of detentions by county throughout the year. The majority of counties had fewer than 100 detentions during the year.

Figure 16: Detentions by County – Calendar Year 2013




Residential Placement Activity

There were 9,407 out-of-home residential placements made during calendar year 2013, comprised of 5,326 non-secure residential placements and 4,081 secure correctional placements⁹. The average daily population (ADP) of juveniles in non-secure residential placement or secure correctional placement was 1,003 and 1,135, respectively. Figure 17 highlights secure correctional facility ADP for the seven Texas regions. A star indicates counties with a secure post-adjudication placement facility.¹⁰

In calendar year 2013, the overall average length of stay in placement was 125.16 days. Secure correctional placements had a longer average length of stay than non-secure residential by just over 45 days (150.83 versus 105.49, respectively). Of the 4,453 non-secure placement terminations during the year, 83.3% ended upon successful completion while 16.7% ended unsuccessfully. Successful completions accounted for 89.9% of the 3,047 secure placement terminations during the year while 10.1% ended unsuccessfully.

Appendix A: Glossary of Juvenile Probation Terminology

General Terms

Active Cases: Cases detained, placed, or supervised during a specified period.

Average Daily Population: Average number of active juveniles detained, placed or supervised per day during a specified period.

Average Length of Stay: average number of days completed cases spent in detention, in placement or under supervision during a specified period.

Child (Juvenile): Section 51.02(16) of the Texas Family Code specifies a “child” is a person who is 10 years or older and under 17; or 17 years or older and under 18, who is alleged or found to have engaged in delinquent conduct or conduct indicating a need for supervision as a result of acts committed before turning 17.

Conduct Indicating a Need for Supervision (CINS): Conduct, set out in Section 51.03(b) of the Texas Family Code, other than a traffic offense, involving fine-only offenses such as running away, inhalant abuse, expulsion from school, prostitution and sexting.

Delinquent Conduct: Conduct, set out in Section 51.03(a)(1) of the Texas Family Code, other than a traffic offense, that violates a criminal law of Texas or of the United States and is punishable by imprisonment or by confinement in jail.

Department: An organized juvenile probation department delivering services in one or more counties and whom a juvenile board supervises.

Detention: A secure facility administered by a governing board that includes construction and fixtures designed to physically restrict the movements and activities of juveniles or other individuals held in lawful custody in the facility and is used for the temporary placement of any juvenile or other individual who is accused of having committed an offense and is awaiting court action, an administrative hearing, or other transfer action. A pre-adjudication secure detention facility does not include a short-term detention facility as defined by Section 51.12(j) of the Texas Family Code. For additional information, refer to subchapters A, B, C, and E of the Texas Administrative Code Chapter 343.

Formal Referral: Any occasion when all four of the following conditions exist: (1) delinquent conduct, conduct indicating a need for supervision, or violation of probation was allegedly committed; (2) the juvenile probation department has jurisdiction and venue; (3) face-to-face contact occurs with the office or official designated by the juvenile board; and (4) the alleged offense has been presented as the reason for this contact.

Juvenile Board: A body established by law to oversee the provision of juvenile probation services to a county or counties.

Juvenile Court: A court designated under Section 51.04 of the Texas Family Code, or by other law, to exercise jurisdiction over proceedings under Title 3 of the Texas Family Code.

Non-Secure Correctional Facility: Any public or private residential facility operated by or under contract with a juvenile board in which the construction fixtures, hardware, staffing models, and procedures do not restrict the egress of residents from the facility. For additional information, refer to Chapter 355 of the Texas Administrative Code.

Paper Formalized Referral: Occurs when a referral that began as a Paper Complaint (paperwork only) is later formalized with face-to-face contact.

Program: A program is a planned or coordinated activity or group of activities designed to address a specific purpose or goal including, but not limited to, altering a juvenile’s behavior to reduce delinquency. To be considered a program, there must be a curriculum, strategy, or plan to achieve the designated goal(s). Participation in a program is either required or tied to the juvenile’s supervision.

Post-Adjudication Secure Residential Facility: Secure facility administered by a governing board that includes construction and fixtures designed to restrict physically the movements and activities of the residents and is intended for the treatment and

rehabilitation of youth who have been adjudicated. As defined in Chapter 343 of the Texas Administrative code, a post-adjudication secure correctional facility does not include any non-secure residential program operating under the authority of a governing board.

Residential Placement: Supervision ordered by a juvenile court in accordance with Texas Family Code section 54.05(d)(1)(B) where the juvenile is placed on probation outside the child's home in a foster home or a public or private institution or agency. For additional information refer to Chapter 341 of the Texas Administrative Code.

Status Offender: A child who is accused, adjudicated or convicted for conduct that would not be a crime if committed by an adult. For specific status offense categories, see Texas Family Code Section 51.02(15).

Dispositions

Adjudicated Probation: Disposition option set forth in Texas Family Code Section 54.04(d)(1) in which a juvenile who has been found to have engaged in delinquent conduct and/or child in need of supervision is formally placed on probation under the supervision of the juvenile court for a specified period of time. The juvenile has been adjudicated and placed on probation in the child's own home, or in the custody of a relative or other fit person. The juvenile may be required to participate in a variety of appropriate programmatic services (e.g., counseling, community services, etc.) and may also be subject to other reasonable court-ordered restrictions or conditions.

Adjudicated to Probation with Placement: This is a disposition option set forth in Texas Family Code Section 54.04(d)(1) in which a juvenile who has been found to have engaged in delinquent conduct and/or child in need of supervision is formally placed on probation under the supervision of the juvenile court for a specified period of time. The adjudicated juvenile is placed on probation and ordered to placement in a special facility. The juvenile may be required to participate in a variety of appropriate programmatic services, and may also be subject to other reasonable court-ordered restrictions or conditions.

Certification as Adult: A discretionary procedural action described in Texas Family Code Section 54.02 in which the juvenile court transfers its jurisdiction to the criminal court in order to allow a juvenile to be prosecuted as an adult. Depending on the type of felony conduct alleged, a juvenile as young as fourteen (14) year of age may be certified to stand trial as an adult.

Commitment: A juvenile committed to the care, control and custody of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD). In 2012, all commitments to TJJD, except those under the determinate sentencing act, were for an indeterminate term not to extend beyond the juvenile's 19th birthday.

Consolidated Case and Disposed in Another Case: A situation wherein multiple offenses are alleged in one petition or in multiple petitions. The offenses are disposed of in one disposition event.

Deferred Prosecution: This is a voluntary dispositional alternative to adjudication in which the juvenile, parent/guardian(s) and the court agree upon supervision conditions. As amended during the 78th Legislative Session in 2003, Texas Family Code Section 53.03(i) and (j) authorize the juvenile court to place a juvenile on deferred prosecution. The provisions also allow a juvenile to be supervised for up to one year or a combined period not to exceed one year if the time is added to a previous order of deferred prosecution.

Determinate Commitment: Disposition in which a juvenile is adjudicated for delinquent conduct that violates a penal law listed in Texas Family Code Section 53.045(a) as alleged in a determinate sentence petition that has been approved by a grand jury. Under determinate sentencing provisions of the Texas Family Code Section 54.04(q), a juvenile may be committed to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) for a specified term of up to 40 years with a possible transfer to the institution division of the Texas department of Criminal Justice. TJJD has established minimum lengths of stay for all determinate sentenced offenders. Refer to Texas Human Resources Code Section 61.081.

Dismissed/Withdrawn/No Probable Cause: A disposition possibility from either the probation department, prosecutor, or court. At the department level, an alleged offense against the juvenile will not be pursued and no disposition will be imposed. At the prosecutor level, the prosecuting attorney reviews the circumstances and allegations of a referral for legal sufficiency and the desirability of prosecution and determines that no probable cause exists. At the court level, a court has reviewed the circumstances and allegations of a referral for prosecution and determined there is lack of evidence, thereby terminating all proceedings.

Indeterminate Commitment: This is a disposition in which a juvenile who has been found to have engaged in delinquent conduct is eligible for commitment to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) for an indeterminate or unspecified term not to exceed his or her 19th birthday. In order to meet the statutory commitment criteria, a juvenile's offense history shall match one of the felony or misdemeanor offense adjudication patterns set forth in Texas Family Code Sections 54.04(d)(2), (k), (s) and (t).

Modified and/or Extended Probation: This is an extension or revision of a prior court order, in which the juvenile continues probation in the child's home, or in the custody of a relative or other fit person. This extension may result in additional supervision time or other programmatic sanctions and/or services.

Non-Suited: The prosecuting attorney reviews the circumstances and allegations of a referral for legal sufficiency and the desirability of prosecution and files a petition with the juvenile court. The petition is subsequently dismissed with or without prejudice.

Refused: The prosecuting attorney reviews the circumstances and allegations of a referral for legal sufficiency and the desirability of prosecution; however, the prosecuting attorney refuses to prosecute the case due to insufficient evidence, unavailable witnesses, etc. The case is closed without a petition being filed or sanctions imposed.

Supervision: Involves the case management of a juvenile by the assigned juvenile probation officer or designee through contacts (face-to-face, telephone, office, home, collateral) with the juvenile, the juvenile's family, and other case planning participants. For additional information refer to Chapter 341 of the Texas Administrative Code.

Supervisory Caution: This is a judicial summary disposition made by the court or other authorized person. This informal disposition option may include counseling the juvenile about the consequences of his or her conduct, contacting the juvenile's parents to inform them of the juvenile's behavior or referring the juvenile to a social service agency or a community-based first offender program run by law enforcement. See Texas Family Code Sections 52.03, 52.031, 52.032, 59.004, and 264.302.

Supervision Types and Outcomes

Absent without Permission: The juvenile fails to report or cannot be found. The timeframe for not reporting for supervision is no more than 45 days from the time the juvenile is considered absent.

Completed: The juvenile completed the supervision without incident.

Conditional Pre-Disposition Supervision: This supervision type is either ordered by the court or ordered by the probation department with authority from the judge. Most conditional pre-disposition supervisions are done at the time of the detention hearing, but juveniles can be placed under this supervision type without having been detained. The conditions should be limited to those that are reasonable and necessary to ensure the juvenile will return to court.

Court Ordered Probation: See above disposition definition.

Deferred Prosecution: See above disposition definition.

Failure to Comply: Supervision terminated before the anticipated end date because of a new offense or because the juvenile refused to accept services and/or was persistently non-compliant with the terms of supervision.

Temporary Pre-Court Monitoring: This is an unofficial form of pre-dispositional supervision used only when a juvenile is pending a disposition decision or court action. Temporary supervision can be done on a voluntary basis if agreed to by the juvenile and the juvenile's parents. There is no Family Code basis for this supervision type; therefore, a juvenile cannot be sanctioned for not following the conditions set forth.

TJJD Commitment: The juvenile's supervision ended as a result of commitment to the Texas Juvenile Justice Department.

Transferred out of Jurisdiction: The juvenile's supervision ended because the juvenile moved from one jurisdiction to another and services were transferred to the new jurisdiction. This outcome is used when a juvenile leaves one jurisdiction on an Interstate Compact or Inter-County transfer, and for juveniles on determinate probation who are transferred to the adult system.

Transferred to the Adult System: The juvenile's supervision ended because the juvenile was transferred to the adult system due to new/additional charges.
