PUBLIC INFORMATION ARREST SUMMARY

On March 28, 2022, Deputy Inspectors General with the Office of Inspector General (OIG) at the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) arrested former Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) Youth Development Coach **Allishia Jackson (28)**. On March 15, 2022, **Allishia Jackson** was indicted by the Cooke County Grand Jury for Prohibited Substance in a Correctional Facility. The alleged offense is a Third Degree Felony under the Texas Penal Code Chapter 38.11, punishable by up to a \$10,000 fine and confinement in prison for a period of 2 to 10 years. This case is being prosecuted by the Special Prosecution Unit.

This indictment and arrest emanated from an investigation conducted by Deputy Inspectors of an incident which occurred in May 2021. **Allishia Jackson** entered the Gainesville State School with a liquid alcoholic beverage concealed in a plastic bottle. **Allishia Jackson** consumed the beverage on duty while supervising TJJD juvenile offenders. This case was submitted to the Special Prosecution Unit for prosecution in August 2021.

The Office of the Inspector General is statutorily responsible to investigate criminal allegations involving TJJD juveniles, TJJD employees, or TJJD facilities, contractors, or programs.
