PUBLIC INFORMATION ARREST SUMMARY

On May 17, 2022, Inspectors with the Office the Inspector General (OIG) at the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) arrested former Juvenile Supervision Officer (JSO) Mallory Jean Largo (31) on a felony warrant for one count of Violation of Civil Rights of Person in Custody; Improper Sexual Activity with Person in Custody or Under Supervision. Largo was booked into the Hood County Jail by OIG Inspectors without incident. This offense is a First Degree Felony under the Tex. Pen. Code Chapter 39.04. If convicted, this offense is punishable by imprisonment in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice for life or for any term of not more than 99 years or less than 5 years and a fine up to \$10,000.00.

The arrest warrant emanated from an investigation conducted by the OIG of an incident report in April 2022. While employed as a JSO at Rite of Passage, a private juvenile correctional facility in Granbury, Texas, Largo is believed to have engaged in sexual contact with a 17-year-old male resident. The case will be prosecuted by the Hood County District Attorney.

The Office of the Inspector General is the independent law enforcement agency that is statutorily responsible to investigate criminal allegations involving TJJD juveniles, TJJD employees, TJJD facilities, contractors, or programs of the Texas juvenile justice system.
