(a) **Standard.**

Each youth returning to a halfway house from a furlough or conditional placement receives a health screening by the human services specialist (HSS) or a juvenile correctional officer (JCO) during the routine check-in process.

(b) **Procedures.**

- (1) Upon a youth's return to a halfway house from a furlough or conditional placement, the **HSS** or a **JCO** completes a health screening by:
 - (A) interviewing and observing the youth; and
 - (B) documenting all information on a [Halfway House: Post-Furlough/Conditional Placement Health Screening form, HLS-308](#).
 - (2) Upon completion of the health screening, the **HSS** or **JCO**:
 - (A) immediately notifies the superintendent or designee, the health services administrator or designee, a mental health professional, and/or the Incident Reporting Center, as required, if:
 - (i) the youth reports a current health concern and/or staff observes a potential health threat;
 - (ii) the youth reports having been physically injured or harmed while off-campus;
 - (iii) the youth reports sexual activity or abuse while off-campus;
 - (iv) the youth's suicide screen is positive; and/or
 - (v) the youth appears physically and/or mentally impaired; and
 - (B) signs and dates the HLS-308 and places it into the Daily Health Records Binder for review by the assigned institution nurse.
 - (3) During an on-site visit, the **institution nurse**:
 - (A) reviews the HLS-308 for completeness;
 - (B) reports any observed documentation discrepancies to the superintendent and HSS; and
 - (C) scans the HLS-308 into the electronic health record (EHR).
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
