## PUBLIC INFORMATION ARREST SUMMARY

---

On May 20, 2024, inspectors general with the Office of Inspector General (OIG) at the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) arrested Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) Hearing Specialist (HS) David Olive, 68, for the offenses of violation of civil rights of a person in custody and tampering with a governmental record. Violation of civil rights of a person in custody is a Third Degree Felony under the Texas Penal Code Chapter 39.04, punishable by up to a \$10,000 fine and confinement in prison for a period of 2 to 10 years. Tampering with a governmental record is a Class A Misdemeanor punishable by up to a \$4,000 fine and confinement in jail not to exceed one year. This case will be referred to the Special Prosecution Unit.

This arrest emanated from an investigation initiated in April 2024 by the OIG of an incident that occurred on January 17, 2024. While working as a hearing specialist at the McLennan County State Juvenile Correctional Facility, HS Olive is alleged to have made multiple false entries in a governmental record, indicating he conducted a Level II due process hearing for an 18-year-old offender, when in fact the hearing was never held. As a result of this fabrication the victim offender lost privileges for 30 days.

The Office of Inspector General is the independent law enforcement agency that is statutorily responsible for investigating criminal allegations involving TJJD juveniles, TJJD employees, TJJD facilities, contractors, or programs of the Texas juvenile justice system.
