PUBLIC INFORMATION ARREST SUMMARY

On Feb. 21, 2024, Granbury Police Department arrested former Lake Granbury Youth Services Juvenile Supervision Officer Ulysses Taylor, 24, for two counts for the offense of Prohibited Substance in a Correctional Facility. The alleged offense is a third-degree felony under the Texas Penal Code Chapter 38.11, punishable by up to a \$10,000 fine and confinement in prison for a period of two to 10 years.

The arrest stemmed from a joint investigation conducted with the Granbury Police Department and the Office of Inspector General beginning in February of 2023. OIG Inspectors conducted an Abuse, Neglect, and Exploitation investigation working jointly with Granbury Police Department who conducted the criminal investigation and obtained the arrest warrant. Taylor is alleged to have provided a vape pen containing Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) to a juvenile who was in custody at Lake Granbury Youth Services. This investigation will be referred to the Hood County district attorney for prosecution.

The Office of Inspector General is the independent law enforcement agency that is statutorily responsible for investigating criminal allegations involving TJJD juveniles, TJJD employees, TJJD facilities, contractors, or programs of the Texas juvenile justice system.
