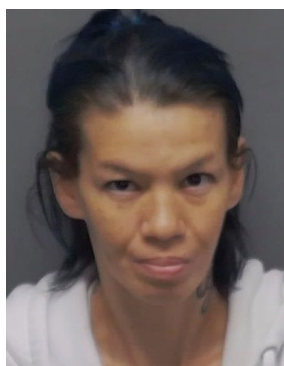
## PUBLIC INFORMATION ARREST SUMMARY

---

On Oct. 22, 2024, inspectors general with the Office of Inspector General (OIG) at the Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) arrested Sabrina Martinez, 37, for delivery of a controlled substance to a child, a 2<sup>nd</sup> degree felony under the Health and Safety Code Chapter 481.122, punishable by up to a \$10,000 fine and confinement in prison for a period of two to 20 years. Martinez was also arrested for possession of a prohibited substance in a correctional facility, a 3<sup>rd</sup> degree felony under the Texas Penal Code Chapter 38.11, punishable by up to a \$10,000 fine and confinement in prison for a period of two to 10 years. Martinez was booked into the Bexar County Jail upon her arrest.

This arrest stemmed from an investigation conducted by OIG at the McLennan County State Juvenile Correctional Facility (MCSJCF), in Mart, in July 2024. Martinez is the mother of child in TJJD custody. Martinez is alleged to have concealed illegal drug contraband during visitation and provided it to the child. This case is being prosecuted by the Special Prosecution Unit (SPU).

The Office of Inspector General is the independent law enforcement agency that is statutorily responsible for investigating criminal allegations involving TJJD juveniles, TJJD employees, TJJD facilities, contractors, or programs of the Texas juvenile justice system.
