2a. APPROACH/METHODOLOGY: Proposed approach and interventions are clearly defined and represent a sound method to address areas of need identified in the program focus. Application provides data supporting the extent of the need being addressed by the project (i.e., number in the target population within the target service area, history of TJJD commitments from target population, history of target population moving deeper into the juvenile justice system, data demonstrating lack of the same or similar services available in the target area, etc.) 2b. SAFETY/SECURITY: Project identifies how it will ensure safety and security and how it directly supports the well-being and protection of youth, staff, and community.	20		
3. REGIONAL APPROACH/SHARING RESOURCES ACROSS DEPT AND/OR AGENCIES: The program utilizes a regional approach or is a program or facility that allows for contracting with other state agencies or probation departments.
